SENATE BILL NO. 2588 (As Passed the Senate)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-313, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE A SEPARATE LICENSE FEE FOR NONRESIDENT CHARTER BOATS; 3 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-15-313, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows:[LTR1] 49-15-313. (1) Any resident between the ages of sixteen 8 (16) and sixty-five (65) years, as defined in Section 49-7-3, 9 fishing in the marine waters of the state, shall obtain a saltwater sports fishing license for a fee of Four Dollars 10 (\$4.00). This license shall be valid in any waters south of 11 12 Interstate 10. Any resident citizen who is blind, paraplegic or a 13 multiple amputee, or who has been adjudged by the Veterans Administration as having a total service-connected disability, or 14 has been adjudged totally disabled by the Social Security 15 Administration shall not be required to purchase or have in his 16 possession a saltwater sports fishing license while engaged in 17 such activities. Any resident exempt under this section shall 18 have on his person while fishing proof of residency and age or 19 20 disability. (2) The commission shall prescribe the forms, types and fees 2.1

- 22 for nonresident saltwater sports fishing licenses except that the
- 23 fee for a nonresident saltwater sports fishing license shall not
- 24 be less than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00). The commission shall
- 25 require a nonresident to purchase a nonresident freshwater fishing
- 26 license and a nonresident saltwater sports fishing license if the

- 27 nonresident's state requires both licenses for a nonresident to
- 28 fish in its marine waters.
- 29 (3) All <u>resident</u> vessels engaged in charter boat fishing,
- 30 party boat fishing, head boat and guide boat fishing shall be
- 31 issued a separate annual license by the commission at a fee of Two
- 32 Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). All nonresident vessels engaged in
- 33 <u>charter boat fishing, party boat fishing, headboat and guide boat</u>
- 34 <u>fishing shall be issued a separate annual license by the</u>
- 35 <u>commission</u>. The commission shall establish the fees for
- 36 <u>nonresident licenses</u>, but the commission shall not charge a
- 37 <u>nonresident a fee greater than the nonresident's domiciliary state</u>
- 38 <u>charges a Mississippi resident for a like license.</u> Crew members
- 39 and customers of the licensed vessels shall not be required to
- 40 purchase an individual resident or nonresident saltwater fishing
- 41 license while sponsored by the licensed vessels. An operator of a
- 42 licensed vessel shall be required to report the number of
- 43 customers to the department as required by the commission and the
- 44 information shall be kept confidential and shall not be released,
- 45 except to other fisheries management agencies or as statistical
- 46 data.
- 47 (4) The saltwater sports fishing license is required for <u>all</u>
- 48 <u>recreational methods of finfish harvest</u>.
- 49 (5) Any resident who purchases a lifetime sportsman's
- 50 license, in accordance with Section 49-7-153, shall be entitled to
- 51 fish in the marine salt waters of the state and shall be exempt
- 52 from the purchase of a sport saltwater fishing license.
- 53 (6) Any person authorized to issue a license may collect and
- 54 retain, for each saltwater fishing license issued, the additional
- 55 fee authorized under Section 49-7-17.
- 56 (7) The fees collected from the sale of resident and
- 57 nonresident saltwater sports fishing licenses shall be deposited
- 58 into the Seafood Fund and shall be used solely for the management
- 59 of marine resources.
- 60 (8) Participants in the Very Special Fishing Olympics are
- 61 exempt from this section.
- 62 (9) July 4 of each year is designated as "Free Saltwater
- 63 Sports Fishing Day." Any person may saltwater sport fish without

- 64 a license on the "Free Saltwater Sports Fishing Day."
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 66 and after July 1, 2000.
