SENATE BILL NO. 2877 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-17-509, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO REVISE EXCLUSIONS UNDER THE LEAD-BASED PAINT ACTIVITY 3 ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION ACT TO BE CONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS; TO CREATE SECTION 49-17-533, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF THE LEAD-BASED PAINT ACTIVITY 5 ACCREDITATION AND CERTIFICATION ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 49-17-509, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 9 amended as follows:[CRG1] 49-17-509. (1) The commission shall adopt regulations for 10 11 accreditation of lead-based paint activity training programs. Accredited training programs shall ensure the availability of, and 12 13 provide adequate facilities for, the delivery of lectures, course tests, hands-on training and assessment activities. This includes 14 providing training equipment that reflects current work practices 15 and maintaining or updating the equipment and facilities as 16 17 needed. The training program shall offer courses which teach work 18 practice standards for conducting lead-based paint activities as adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or 19 the commission under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. These 20 21 standards shall be taught in the appropriate courses to provide trainees with the knowledge needed to perform the lead-based paint 22 activities they are responsible for. The commission also may 23 24 adopt accreditation requirements for training programs providing 25 refresher training programs. 26 (2) The commission shall adopt regulations establishing work

practice standards for performing lead-based paint activities in

target housing and child-occupied facilities. These standards may

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- 29 include appropriate documented methodologies, clearance levels and
- 30 requirements for lead hazard screens, risk assessments, abatement
- 31 activities, sample collection and analysis and record keeping.
- 32 Beginning on August 31, 1998, all lead-based paint activities
- 33 shall be performed in accordance with work practice standards
- 34 adopted under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. The
- 35 commission shall implement a compliance monitoring program to
- 36 ensure compliance with the work practice standards.
- 37 (3) The commission shall adopt regulations for certification
- 38 of lead-based paint risk assessors, project designers,
- 39 supervisors, inspectors and workers.
- 40 (4) Applicants for the issuance or reissuance of
- 41 certificates required under Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-519
- 42 shall submit to the commission, on forms prepared by the
- 43 commission, an application. In addition, the applicant shall
- 44 submit documentation deemed appropriate by the commission
- 45 providing the educational background and demonstrating
- 46 satisfactory completion of the applicable training programs and
- 47 shall pay the applicable fee.
- 48 (5) The commission shall require certificates issued under
- 49 Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-521 to be reissued annually.
- 50 (6) Except as otherwise required by Sections 49-17-501
- 51 through 49-17-531, regulations adopted under Sections 49-17-501
- 52 through 49-17-531 shall be no more stringent than federal
- 53 regulations for lead-based paint activities.
- (7) Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531 do not apply to a
- 55 person who is performing lead-based paint activities or abatement
- of lead-based paint hazards in a residential dwelling owned by
- 57 that person, unless the residential dwelling is occupied by a
- 58 person or persons other than the owner or owner's immediate family
- 59 while these activities are being performed, or a child residing in
- 60 the building has been identified as having an elevated blood lead
- 61 level.
- 62 SECTION 2. This section shall be codified as Section
- 63 49-17-533, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 64 <u>49-17-533.</u> Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531, Mississippi
- 65 Code of 1972, shall stand repealed on July 1, 2002.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

67 and after its passage.
