SENATE BILL NO. 3232
(As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE HANCOCK COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
2 TO APPOINT A SEVEN-MEMBER COMMISSION TO SUPERVISE THE
3 ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HANCOCK COUNTY MULTIPURPOSE
4 EQUINE AND LIVESTOCK FACILITY; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF
5 THE COMMISSION; TO TRANSFER ALL POWERS AND DUTIES, FUNDS AND
6 FACILITIES OF THE HANCOCK COUNTY EQUINE AND LIVESTOCK FACILITY
7 BOARD TO HANCOCK COUNTY; TO ABOLISH THE HANCOCK COUNTY EQUINE AND
8 LIVESTOCK FACILITY BOARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

10 SECTION 1. (1) The Board of Supervisors of Hancock County
11 shall appoint a seven-member commission to supervise the
12 administration and management of the Hancock County multipurpose
13 equine and livestock facility that was constructed with funds
14 provided for in Chapter 525, Laws of 1995. The appointments shall
15 be made as follows: One (1) appointment shall be made by each
16 board member and two (2) members shall be appointed at large by a
17 majority vote of the board.

18 (2) The interest in and title to any equipment, supplies,
19 records, arenas, barns, training tracks, and related facilities,
20 and any funds of the Hancock County multipurpose equine and
21 livestock facility shall be transferred to Hancock County, acting
22 through its board of supervisors, on the effective date of this
23 act.

24 (3) On the effective date of this act, the terms of the
25 members of the Hancock County Equine and Livestock Facility Board
26 shall expire and the Hancock County Equine and Livestock Facility
27 Board shall be abolished.

28 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
29 and after its passage.
