SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 537
(As Adopted by Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING
2 NATCHEZ'S TIMMY FOSTER FOR WINNING THE NFL GATORADE PUNT, PASS AND
3 KICK NATIONAL FINALS IN THE BOYS 10-11 DIVISION.

4 WHEREAS, prior to the Jacksonville Jaguars v. Miami Dolphins
5 NFL-AFC Playoff Game at Jacksonville, Florida's ALLTEL Stadium,
6 Natchez's Timmy Foster captured his own championship, winning the
7 NFL Gatorade Punt, Pass and Kick National Finals in the boys 10-11
8 division; and

9 WHEREAS, Timmy is a 5-foot-4, 125-pound sixth grader at Adams
10 County Christian School, who advanced to the finals by winning
11 separate competitions at the local, sectional and regional events,
12 the final of which was held at the Louisiana Superdome prior to a
13 New Orleans Saints game; and

14 WHEREAS, Timmy went first in his division, and finished with
15 a total composite score of 278.1, which was less than his 322.7
16 winning score in New Orleans (the scores are based on distance
17 minus accuracy in feet); and

18 WHEREAS, his score was actually the third highest in the
19 entire competition, and for his accomplishment, Timmy won a large
20 wooden football trophy on a wooden tee with the Punt, Pass and
21 Kick logo; and

22 WHEREAS, he said that advancing to the finals was a major
23 highlight, but still was second to playing for the state finals in
24 the Dixie Youth 9-10 division in Biloxi, Mississippi; and

25 WHEREAS, Timmy Foster's parents are Tim Foster, Sr., and
26 Angie Foster of Natchez, and it is with great pride that we

27 recognize the accomplishments of this outstanding young athlete
28 who has brought honor to his school, his community and to the
29 State of Mississippi:

30 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
31 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
32 we do hereby commend and congratulate Timmy Foster, Jr., of
33 Natchez, Mississippi, for winning the NFL's National Punt, Pass
34 and Kick Competition for 10-11 year-old boys, and wish him
35 continued success in his future scholastic and athletic endeavors.
