- PARTICIPATION IN THE 104TH RUNNING OF THE BOSTON MARATHON.
- 4 WHEREAS, the 104th running of the Boston Marathon will have a
- Mississippi flavor as Mrs. Traci Stockdale Null of Corinth, 5
- Mississippi, will join 17,998 other runners in her inaugural trip 6
- 7 through the 26-mile course; and
- WHEREAS, this year's Boston Marathon will host the largest 8
- 9 field since the 100th running in 1996, and those watching the
- race, which begins at 11:00 a.m. CST on Monday, April 24, 2000, 10
- should look for Mrs. Null wearing runner number 13,027; and 11
- 12 WHEREAS, running enthusiasts can't just call up Boston
- 13 Athletic Association officials and turn in entry forms; in order
- to run the Boston race, a runner has to qualify in another 14
- certified marathon to make it; Null qualified by pulling out a 15
- 3:41:30 finish time in the Rock and Roll Marathon, a fundraiser 16
- for leukemia, in San Diego, California; and 17
- WHEREAS, training for a 26-mile run is a lot different than 18
- training for a 10K race and for Null, her training became a 19
- 20 continuation of what she had done to get ready to run in
- California, running five out of seven days with Friday and Sunday 21
- being rest days including a short run which is 12 to 14 miles, and 22
- a long run which is 18 to 24 miles; and 23
- WHEREAS, the biggest part of running a road race of this 24
- 25 caliber is the mental portion and according to Traci, the end of
- 26 the race is probably the hardest part of it; and

- 27 WHEREAS, Boston Marathon history records the first race in
- 28 1897 pitting 15 men who started from a line drawn in the dirt with
- 29 the heel of a shoe; today, runners' times are kept track of with
- 30 microchips attached to shoes and more than 6,000 volunteers are
- 31 needed to keep the race going; and
- 32 WHEREAS, running the Boston Marathon has not been a life-long
- 33 dream for Null, but qualifying to run was an opportunity she
- 34 couldn't pass up; and
- 35 WHEREAS, traveling to Boston with Null will be her daughter,
- 36 Sadie, and her parents, Truman and Elaine Stockdale, and her
- 37 sister, Tina, while her husband, Ray, and other daughter,
- 38 Samantha, will watch the race on television; and
- 39 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the
- 40 athletic ability and determination of this citizen who brings
- 41 honor to her family, her community and to the State of
- 42 Mississippi:
