Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting 7 in lieu thereof the following:

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- 9 SECTION 1. Section 49-17-509, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:
- 49-17-509. (1) The commission shall adopt regulations for 11 12accreditation of lead-based paint activity training programs. 13Accredited training programs shall ensure the availability of, and 14provide adequate facilities for, the delivery of lectures, course 15 tests, hands-on training and assessment activities. This includes 16 providing training equipment that reflects current work practices 17 and maintaining or updating the equipment and facilities as The training program shall offer courses which teach work 18 needed. 19 practice standards for conducting lead-based paint activities as 20 adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or 21the commission under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. 22standards shall be taught in the appropriate courses to provide 23 trainees with the knowledge needed to perform the lead-based paint 24activities they are responsible for. The commission also may 25adopt accreditation requirements for training programs providing 26 refresher training programs.
- 27 (2) The commission shall adopt regulations establishing work 28practice standards for performing lead-based paint activities in

29 target housing and child-occupied facilities. These standards may 30 include appropriate documented methodologies, clearance levels and 31 requirements for lead hazard screens, risk assessments, abatement 32 activities, sample collection and analysis and record keeping. 33 Beginning on August 31, 1998, all lead-based paint activities 34 shall be performed in accordance with work practice standards 35 adopted under Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531. The 36 commission shall implement a compliance monitoring program to 37 ensure compliance with the work practice standards.

- 38 (3) The commission shall adopt regulations for certification 39 of lead-based paint risk assessors, project designers, 40 supervisors, inspectors and workers.
- 41 (4) Applicants for the issuance or reissuance of
 42 certificates required under Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-519
 43 shall submit to the commission, on forms prepared by the
 44 commission, an application. In addition, the applicant shall
 45 submit documentation deemed appropriate by the commission
 46 providing the educational background and demonstrating
 47 satisfactory completion of the applicable training programs and
 48 shall pay the applicable fee.
- 49 (5) The commission shall require certificates issued under 50 Sections 49-17-511 through 49-17-521 to be reissued annually.
- 51 (6) Except as otherwise required by Sections 49-17-501 52through 49-17-531, regulations adopted under Sections 49-17-501 53through 49-17-531 shall be no more stringent than federal 54regulations for lead-based paint activities.
- 55 (7) Sections 49-17-501 through 49-17-531 do not apply to a 56person who is performing lead-based paint activities or abatement 57 of lead-based paint hazards in a residential dwelling owned by 58 that person, unless the residential dwelling is occupied by a 59 person or persons other than the owner or owner's immediate family 60 while these activities are being performed, or a child residing in 61 the building has been identified as having an elevated blood lead 62 level.
- 63 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

64 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
