## House Bill NO. 111

## By Senator(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting 7 in lieu thereof the following:

- 9 SECTION 1. Section 77-9-249, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:
- 11 77-9-249. (1) Whenever any person driving a vehicle
  12approaches a railroad grade crossing under any of the
  13circumstances stated in this section, the driver of such vehicle
  14shall stop within fifty (50) feet but not less than fifteen (15)
  15feet from the nearest rail of such railroad, and shall not proceed
  16until he can do so safely. The foregoing requirements shall apply
  17when:
- 18 (a) A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal 19device gives warning of the immediate approach of a railroad 20train;
- 21 (b) A crossing gate is lowered or when a human flagman 22gives or continues to give a signal of the approach or passage of 23a railroad train;
- 24 (c) A railroad train approaching within approximately 25nine hundred (900) feet of the highway crossing emits a signal in 26accordance with Section 77-9-225, and such railroad train, by 27reason of its speed or nearness to such crossing, is an immediate 28hazard;

- 29 (d) An approaching railroad train is plainly visible 30 and is in hazardous proximity to such crossing.
- 31 (2) No person shall drive any vehicle through, around or 32under any crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing while 33 such gate or barrier is closed or is being opened or closed.
- 34 (3) In the trial of all actions to recover personal injury
  35 or property damages, sustained by any driver of such vehicles for
  36 collision of said vehicle and train in which action it may appear
  37 that the said driver may have violated any of the provisions
  38 hereof, the question of whether or not the said violation was the
  39 sole or approximate cause of the accident and injury shall be for
  40 the jury to determine. The violation of this section shall not of
  41 itself defeat recovery, and the question of negligence or the
  42 violation aforesaid shall be left to the jury; and the comparative
  43 negligence statutes and prima facie statute of this state shall
  44 apply in these cases as in other cases of negligence.
- 45 (4) At any railroad grade crossing provided with visible
  46railroad crossbuck signs without automatic electric or mechanical
  47signal devices, crossing gates or a human flagman giving a signal
  48of the approach or passage of a train, the driver of a vehicle
  49shall, in obedience to such railroad crossbuck sign, yield the
  50right-of-way and slow to a speed reasonable for the existing
  51conditions, and shall stop if required for safety at a clearly
  52marked stop line, or if no stop line, within fifty (50) feet, but
  53not less than fifteen (15) feet, from the nearest rail of the
  54railroad, and shall not proceed until he can do so safely.
- 55 (5) Every person, company or corporation violating the 56provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, 57upon conviction, shall be fined not more than <u>Five Hundred Dollars</u> 58(\$500.00) \* \* \*.
- 59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after July 1, 2000.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-9-249, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2TO REVISE THE PENALTY THAT MAY BE IMPOSED UPON A MOTOR VEHICLE 3 OPERATOR WHO FAILS TO BE OBEDIENT TO CERTAIN TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 4AT RAILROAD GRADE CROSSINGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
