## House Bill NO. 175

5 Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting 6in lieu thereof the following:

- 8 SECTION 1. Section 31-3-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 amended as follows:
- 10 31-3-14. (1) In addition to the fees required for 11application and renewal for certification and registration of all 12contractors in Section 31-3-13, all holders of a certificate of 13responsibility shall pay a fee equal to One Hundred Dollars 14(\$100.00) at the time of application or renewal of certificates of 15responsibility. Any residential builder licensed under the 16 provisions of Section 73-59-1 et seq. shall be exempt from the fee 17 imposed under this section. The revenue derived from such 18 additional fees shall be deposited into the "Construction 19 Education Fund, " a special fund hereby created in the State 20 Treasury, and distributed by the State Board of Contractors 21created in Section 31-3-3, to \* \* \* public high schools and 22 community colleges that participate in the Mississippi 23Construction Education Foundation's "school-to-work" program and 24 state universities that have construction technology programs and 25certain construction educational trusts approved by the State 26 Board of Contractors in the manner hereinafter provided to offer 27 courses for construction education and construction craft training

28 to meet the needs of the construction industry of the State of 29 Mississippi.

- (2) The State Board of Contractors shall, on an annual 31basis, solicit from the Mississippi state institutions of higher 32 learning, all the public community and junior colleges, the 33Mississippi Construction Education Foundation, public high schools 34that participate in the Mississippi Construction Education 35Foundation's "school-to-work" program and certain construction 36 educational trusts, applications for the use of such funds in 37 construction education and craft training programs in a manner 38prescribed by the board. The board may appoint a technical 39advisory committee to advise the board on the most needed areas of 40 construction education and craft training, continuing education or 41 research relating to the construction education and craft training 42in the state, based on significant changes in the construction 43 industry's practices, economic development or on problems costing 44public or private contractors substantial waste. The board shall 45 ensure that the monies distributed from this fund are properly 46 spent to promote construction education and craft training in 47programs in the state which are approved by the board. At least 48 seventy-five percent (75%) of the monies distributed by the board, 49 pursuant to this section, must be used for construction craft 50 training.
- 51 (3) Each university, junior college, community college, the
  52Mississippi Construction Education Foundation, public high schools
  53that participate in the foundation's "school-to-work" program or
  54construction educational trust receiving funds pursuant to this
  55section for construction education or construction craft training
  56programs shall utilize such funds only for construction education
  57 and craft training curricula and program development, faculty
  58development, equipment, student scholarships, student
  59assistantships, and for continuing education programs related to
  60construction education and craft training. Such funds shall not
  61be commingled with the normal operating funds of the educational
  62institution, regardless of the source of such funds.

- (4) The State Board of Contractors shall ensure the 64distribution of reports and the availability of construction 65education programs established pursuant to this section to all 66segments of the construction industry that are subject to the fee 67provided under this section. The board shall cause a report to be 68made to the Legislature in October of each year, summarizing the 69allocation of funds by institution or program and summarizing the 70new projects funded and the status of previously funded projects.
- 71 (5) All monies deposited into the "Construction Education 72Fund" shall be used exclusively for construction education and 73craft training and any unspent funds at the end of the fiscal year 74shall not revert to the General Fund of the State Treasury but 75shall be available for construction education and craft training 76in subsequent fiscal years.
- 77 (6) All expenditures from the "Construction Education Fund"
  78 shall be by requisition to the State Auditor, signed by the
  79 executive secretary of the board and countersigned by the chairman
  80 or vice chairman of the board, and the State Treasurer shall issue
  81 his warrants thereon.
- 82 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 83 and after July 1, 2000.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 31-3-14, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2REVISE THE USE AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE CONSTRUCTION EDUCATION 3 FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
