WHEREAS, a strong domestic oil and natural gas industry is vitally important to the United States' economy and national defense; and WHEREAS, the United States' domestic oil and gas production

natural gas reserves; and
WHEREAS, for the first time since 1988, the federal Mineral

Management Service (MMS) has scheduled on December 5, 2001, an OCS
