- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 8
- (1) It is unlawful for any person or peace 9 63-3-519.
- officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 10
- Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of 11
- radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 12
- highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: 13
- 14 (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a
- municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more 15
- 16 upon the public streets of the municipality;
- (b) By any college or university campus police force 17
- within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand 18
- (2,000) students are enrolled; 19
- (c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any 20
- 21 municipality having a population in excess of six thousand five
- 22 hundred (6,500) according to the latest federal census on
- 23 federally designated highways lying within the corporate limits.
- The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol may not set up 24
- radar on highways within municipalities with a population in 25
- excess of six thousand five hundred (6,500) according to the 26
- 27 latest federal census.

28 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

29 and after July 1, 2001.
