- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-159-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 37-159-3. (1) There is established the "Critical Needs
  Teacher Scholarship Program," the purpose of which is to attract
  qualified teachers to those geographical areas of the state where
  there exists a critical shortage of teachers by awarding full
  scholarships to persons declaring an intention to serve in the
  teaching field who actually render service \* \* \* while possessing
- 22 (2) Any individual who is enrolled in or accepted for
- 23 enrollment at a baccalaureate degree-granting institution of
- 24 higher learning whose teacher education program is approved by the
- 25 State Board of Education or at an accredited, nonprofit community
- 26 or junior college in the State of Mississippi who expresses in
- 27 writing an intention to teach in a geographical area of the state
- 28 in which there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as
- 29 designated by the State Board of Education, shall be eligible for
- 30 a financial scholarship to be applied toward the costs of the

received four (4) annual awards, or the equivalent of four (4) 64 65 annual awards, shall render three (3) years' service as a licensed 66 teacher. Any person who received fewer than four (4) annual 67 awards, or the equivalent of four (4) annual awards, shall render 68 one (1) year's service as a licensed teacher for each year that 69 the person received a full-time student scholarship, or for the 70 number of academic hours equivalent to one (1) school year, as determined by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 71 Higher Learning, which a part-time student received a scholarship. 72 73 Any person failing to complete a program of study which 74 will enable that person to become a licensed teacher shall become liable immediately to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions 75 76 of Higher Learning for the sum of all Critical Needs Teacher 77 Scholarship awards made to that person, plus interest accruing at 78 the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person abrogates his participation in the program. Any person failing to complete 79 80 his teaching obligation, as required under subsection (4) of this section, shall become liable immediately to the board for the sum 81 of all scholarship awards made to that person less the 82 83 corresponding amount of any awards for which service has been 84 rendered, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 85 at the time the person discontinues his service, except in the case of a deferral of debt for cause by the State Board of 86 87 Education when there is no employment position immediately 88 available upon a teacher's completion of licensure requirements. After the period of such deferral, such person shall begin or 89 90 resume teaching duties as required under subsection (4) or shall become liable to the board under this subsection. If a claim for 91 payment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an 92 attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an 93

additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee.

- 95 (6) The obligations made by the recipient of a Critical 96 Needs Teacher Scholarship award shall not be voidable by reason of 97 the age of the student at the time of receiving the scholarship.
- 98 (7) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 99 Learning and the State Board of Education shall jointly promulgate 100 rules and regulations necessary for the proper administration of 101 the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program. The Board of 102 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall be the

administering agency of the program.

- 104 (8) If insufficient funds are available to fully fund
  105 scholarship awards to all eligible students, the Board of Trustees
  106 of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall make the awards to
  107 first-time students on a first-come, first-served basis; however,
  108 priority consideration shall be given to persons previously
  109 receiving awards under the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship
  110 Program.
- 111 (9) All funds received by the Board of Trustees of State
  112 Institutions of Higher Learning from the repayment of scholarship
  113 awards by program participants shall be deposited in the
  114 Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-159-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- The State Board of Education shall prescribe rules 37-159-5. 117 and regulations which, subject to available appropriations, allow 118 119 for reimbursement to the state licensed teachers, from both in-state and out-of-state, who enter into a contract for 120 121 employment in a school district or in a nonpublic school that 122 maintains educational standards equivalent to the standards established by the State department of Education for the state 123 schools, as outlined in the Approval Requirements of the State 124 125 Board of Education for Nonpublic Schools, situated within a 126 geographical area of the state where there exists a critical

Education, for the expense of moving when the employment 128 129 necessitates the relocation of the teacher to a different 130 geographical area than that in which the teacher resides before 131 entering into such contract. In order to be eligible for the 132 reimbursement, the teacher must apply to the local district or 133 approved nonpublic school, and the district or approved nonpublic 134 school must obtain the prior approval from the department for reimbursement before the relocation occurs. If the reimbursement 135 is approved, the department shall provide funds to the school 136 137 district or approved nonpublic school to reimburse the teacher an 138 amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the documented actual expenses incurred in the course of relocating, 139 140 including the expense of any professional moving company or 141 persons employed to assist with the move, rented moving vehicles or equipment, mileage in the amount authorized for state employees 142 under Section 25-3-41, if the teacher used his personal vehicle or 143 144 vehicles for the move, meals and such other expenses associated 145 with the relocation in accordance with the department's established rules and regulations. No teacher may be reimbursed 146 147 for moving expenses under this section on more than one (1) 148 occasion. 149 Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the 150 actual residence to which the teacher relocates to be within the boundaries of the school district which has executed a contract 151 152 for employment with the teacher or within the boundaries of the area designated by the State Board of Education as the critical 153 154 teacher shortage area in order for the teacher to be eligible for 155 reimbursement for his moving expenses. However, teachers must relocate within the boundaries of the State of Mississippi. 156 157 SECTION 3. Section 37-159-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 158 amended as follows: 159 37-159-9. (1) There is established the University Assisted

The purposes of the program shall be to 162 attract additional qualified teachers to those geographical areas 163 of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers 164 and to retain the qualified teachers already serving as licensed 165 teachers in geographical critical teacher shortage areas by making 166 available scholarships to persons working towards a Master of Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at an 167 institution of higher learning whose teacher education program is 168 approved by the State Board of Education. 169

- (2) Any institution of higher learning in the State of 170 171 Mississippi which offers a Master of Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree may apply to the department for 172 173 participation in the program. As part of the program, 174 participating institutions shall collaborate with the Mississippi Teacher Center to identify, recruit and place teacher education 175 176 graduates, from both within the state and out-of-state, in school districts or in nonpublic schools that maintain educational 177 178 standards equivalent to the standards established by the State Department of Education for the state schools, as outlined in the 179 180 Approval Requirements of the State Board of Education for Nonpublic Schools, situated within those areas of the state where 181 182 there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the 183 State Board of Education.
- (3) The State Department of Education shall provide funds to 184 185 participating institutions of higher learning for the purpose of awarding scholarships to qualified persons pursuing a Master of 186 187 Education degree or an Educational Specialist degree at such 188 institutions while rendering service \* \* \* as a licensed teacher in a school district or an approved nonpublic school in a 189 190 geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by the State Board of Education. 191 192 The financial scholarship shall be applied to the total cost for 193 tuition, books, materials and fees at the institution in which the

- 194 student is enrolled, not to exceed an amount equal to the highest
- 195 total cost of tuition, books, materials and fees assessed by a
- 196 state institution of higher learning during that school year.
- 197 Teachers who relocate within Mississippi from out-of-state in
- 198 order to participate in the program shall be classified as
- 199 residents of the state for tuition purposes.
- 200 (4) Students awarded financial scholarships under the
- 201 University Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant
- 202 Program may receive such awards for a maximum of four (4) school
- 203 years; however, the maximum number of awards which may be made
- 204 shall not exceed the length of time required to complete the
- 205 number of academic hours necessary to obtain a Master of Education
- 206 degree or an Educational Specialist degree. Financial
- 207 scholarships under the program shall not be based upon an
- 208 applicant's eligibility for financial aid.
- 209 (5) Persons relocating to a geographical area of the state
- 210 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by
- 211 the State Board of Education, to participate in the University
- 212 Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program shall be
- 213 eligible for reimbursement for their moving expenses to the
- 214 critical teacher shortage area from the State Board of Education.
- 215 The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and
- 216 regulations necessary for the administration of the relocation
- 217 expense reimbursement component of the University Assisted Teacher
- 218 Recruitment and Retention Grant Program.
- 219 (6) Subject to the availability of funds, the State Board of
- 220 Education may provide for professional development and support
- 221 services as may be necessary for the retention of teachers
- 222 participating in the program in those geographical areas of the
- 223 state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers.
- (7) Any person participating in the program who fails to
- 225 complete a program of study that will enable that person to obtain
- 226 a Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist degree

shall become liable immediately to the State Board of Education 227 228 for the sum of all awards made to that person under the program, 229 plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the 230 time the person abrogates his participation in the program. 231 As a condition for participation in the program, a 232 teacher shall agree to employment as a licensed teacher in a school district or an approved nonpublic school located in a 233 geographical area of the state where there exists a critical 234 shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of 235 Education, for a period of not less than three (3) years, which 236 237 shall include those years of service rendered while obtaining the Master of Education degree or Educational Specialist degree. 238 239 However, for any person who obtained a baccalaureate degree in 240 education with a financial scholarship under the Critical Needs 241 Teacher Scholarship Program and who entered the University 242 Assisted Teacher Recruitment and Retention Grant Program before 243 rendering service as a teacher, the period of employment for the 244 purposes of this subsection shall be two (2) years, in addition to the employment commitment required under the Critical Needs 245 246 Teacher Scholarship Program. Service rendered by a participant as 247 a licensed teacher in a school district in a geographical critical 248 teacher shortage area before that teacher becomes a participant in 249 the program may not be considered to fulfill the employment 250 commitment required under this subsection. Any person failing to 251 comply with this employment commitment in any required school year shall immediately be in breach of contract and become liable 252 253 immediately to the State Department of Education for the sum of 254 all scholarships awarded and relocation expenses granted to that person, less one-third (1/3) of the amount of that sum for each 255 256 year that service was rendered, or for those persons whose 257 required period of employment is two (2) years, less one-half 258 (1/2) of the amount of that sum for each year that service was 259 rendered, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate \*HR07/R1333\* H. - SECTION 4. Section 37-159-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 281 37-159-11. (1) There is established the Mississippi
- 282 Employer-Assisted Housing Teacher Program, which shall be a
- 283 special home loan program for eligible licensed teachers who
- 284 render service \* \* \* in a geographical area of the state where
- 285 there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the
- 286 State Board of Education. The home loan program shall be
- 287 administered by the State Department of Education in conjunction
- 288 with the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae). The
- 289 department may contract with one or more public or private
- 290 entities to provide assistance in implementing and administering
- 291 the program. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and

regulations regarding the implementation and administration of the program.

- Participation in the loan program shall be available to 294 (2) 295 any licensed teacher who renders service in a school district or 296 in a nonpublic school that maintains educational standards 297 equivalent to the standards established by the State Department of 298 Education for the state schools, as outlined in the approval 299 Requirements of the State Board of Education for Nonpublic 300 Schools, in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of 301 302 Education. Any person who receives a loan under the program shall 303 be required to purchase a house and reside in a county in which 304 the approved nonpublic school or school district for which the 305 teacher is rendering service, or any portion of the school 306 district, is located. The maximum amount of a loan that may be 307 made under the program to any person shall be Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00).308
  - (3) Any loan made under the program to a person who actually renders service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be converted to an interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan. Any person who does not render three (3) years' service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be liable to the State Department of Education for one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan for each year that he does not render such service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person discontinues his service. If a claim for repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an

additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee.

329 Section 37-159-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 330 amended as follows:

331 37-159-15. The State Department of Education and the Board 332 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall jointly 333 prepare an annual report for the Legislature, to be submitted by December 1 of each year beginning in 1998, which shall assess the 334 335 impact of the teacher recruitment incentive programs authorized 336 under House Bill No. 609, 1998 Regular Session [Laws, 1998, 337 Chapter 544], on the employment of licensed teachers in critical 338 teacher shortage areas. The report shall include, at a minimum, 339 the numbers of persons who have participated in each of the 340 programs each year, and the numbers of persons who have 341 participated in the programs who have rendered service as teachers 342 in critical teacher shortage areas each year by school district or 343
