- 7 Constitution of 1890, is proposed to the qualified electors of the

- 9 Amend Section 153, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 10 as follows:
- 11 "Section 153. The judges of the circuit and chancery courts
- 12 shall be elected by the people in a manner and at a time to be
- 13 provided by the Legislature and the judges shall hold their office
- 14 for a term of eight (8) years."
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be
- 16 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at
- 17 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday
- 18 of November 2002, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution
- 19 and by general law.
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
- 21 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- 22 constitutional amendment will increase the terms of judges of the
- 23 circuit and chancery courts to eight years."
