- 5 WHEREAS, the Ole Miss "Rebels" Boys Basketball Team has
- 6 enjoyed its best-ever season, cruising to a 27-8 overall record,
- 7 an 11-5 SEC mark and the SEC Western Division crown, which was Ole
- 8 Miss' third in the last five years; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the University of Mississippi team, which was ranked
- 10 No. 14 in the Associated Press (AP) Top 25 poll and No. 13 in
- 11 ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll, advanced to the SEC Championship Game
- 12 against Kentucky; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the Rebels were an at-large entry into the NCAA
- 14 Tournament and advanced to its first-ever NCAA Tournament Sweet 16
- 15 appearance and met No. 4 Arizona in the Midwest Regional
- 16 semifinals on Friday, March 23, 2001, losing 65-55 in a very
- 17 hard-fought game, televised by CBS; the Rebels were the No. 3
- 18 seed, while Arizona was the No. 2 seed in the Regional tournament;

- 20 WHEREAS, this was a tough basketball team mentally and
- 21 physically; the Rebels had court savvy and don't beat themselves;
- 22 they weren't afraid of the game's blue-collar aspects, such as
- 23 defense and rebounding; tough man-to-man was the team's calling
- 24 card; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Center Rahim Lockhart, the leading scorer and
- 26 rebounder, was a first-team All-SEC pick; Freshman forward, Justin
- 27 Reed, was chosen the league's top rookie player; there was plenty

- 28 of firepower at the guard positions with David Sanders, Jason
- 29 Holmes and Aaron Harper, and veteran leadership at the point with
- 30 Jason Flanigan and Jason Harrison; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the team was led by Coach Rod Barnes, who was named
- 32 the 2001 Naismith National Men's Coach of the Year and also SEC
