## Senate Bill NO. 2916

## By Representative(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

13 SECTION 1. Section 37-143-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 amended as follows: 37-143-6. (1) There is established a medical education 15 scholarship and loan repayment program, which shall be 16 17 administered by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 18 Higher Learning. Each year, the program shall provide a certain number of eligible applicants, if the applicant meets the 19 20 conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment is granted, with: (a) a full scholarship to obtain a medical 21 22 education at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine at no cost to the recipient; or (b) funds for repaying state and 23 24 federal medical education loans. 25 (2) The program shall provide scholarships or loan 26 repayments to up to twenty (20) new recipients each year, of which 27 no more than ten (10) may be recipients of loan repayments. program shall be funded from monies appropriated from the Health 28 Care Expendable Fund established under Section 43-13-407 \* \* \*. 29

- 30 The amounts that may be expended annually for scholarships and
- 31 <u>loan repayments</u> under the program shall not exceed the following:
- 32 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in fiscal year 2001;
- 33 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2002; One
- 34 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) in fiscal
- 35 year 2003; and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in fiscal year
- 36 2004 and in any later fiscal year.
- 37 (3)  $\underline{A}$  scholarship <u>awarded under this program</u> shall be in an
- 38 amount that will pay the full cost of attendance, as defined by
- 39 federal law and regulation, at the University of Mississippi
- 40 School of Medicine for the entire time necessary for the recipient
- 41 to complete the requirements for a medical degree. The actual
- 42 amount of the scholarship shall be determined by the Office of
- 43 Financial Aid of the University of Mississippi Medical Center but
- 44 shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per
- 45 year for any recipient.
- 46 (4) Before being granted a scholarship, each applicant shall
- 47 enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be
- 48 deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the
- 49 terms and conditions upon which the scholarship will be granted.
- 50 In order to receive a scholarship under the program, the recipient
- 51 must agree in the contract to practice family medicine for a
- 52 period of not less than ten (10) years after completion of his or
- 53 her residency in an area of the state that is a critical needs
- 54 area for primary medical care at the time of the recipient's entry
- 55 into medical practice. The determination and designation of the
- 56 areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary
- 57 medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice shall be
- 58 made by a committee to be known as the Medical Care Critical Needs
- 59 Committee, which shall be composed of the following persons: the

60 Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs of the University of 61 Mississippi Medical Center, who shall be chairman of the 62 committee; the Executive Director of the State Department of Health; the Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid; the 63 64 President of the Mississippi State Medical Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi State Hospital 65 Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi 66 Academy of Family Physicians; and the Executive Director of the 67 Mississippi Primary Health Care Association. The committee shall 68 69 meet at least once annually to determine and designate the areas 70 of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical 71 care in which scholarship recipients may practice family medicine 72 in order to fulfill their contractual obligation. 73 (5) (a) Beginning on July 1, 2001, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning may use any funds available 74 75 under the medical education scholarship and loan repayment program 76 for repaying state and federal medical education loans made to 77 licensed family medicine physicians who agree to practice family 78 79 of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical 80 81 The board of trustees shall use such funds to apply for and

licensed family medicine physicians who agree to practice family medicine for a period of not less than eight (8) years in an area of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical care, as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee.

The board of trustees shall use such funds to apply for and receive federal matching funds from the National Health Service Corps to assist in the repayment of qualified educational loans for primary health care clinicians who agree to practice in a critical needs area for primary medical care. In order to receive a state loan repayment under this section, an applicant must enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the terms and conditions upon which the loan repayment will be granted. The

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90	contract must include all conditions specified under subsection
91	(4) for scholarship recipients; however, for a loan repayment, the
92	minimum period of service required in an area of the state that is
93	a critical needs area for primary medical care at the time the
94	contract is executed is eight (8) years. The contract also must
95	specify the total amount of the loan repayment and a schedule for
96	making payments to the recipient, based upon the recommendation of
97	the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee.
98	(b) The board of trustees shall give priority in
99	rewarding loan repayments to family medicine physicians according
100	to the following:

122 (6) If a scholarship recipient leaves the University of Mississippi School of Medicine before graduation, or leaves his or 123 her residency before completion, or fails to practice family 124 medicine for a period of ten (10) years in a critical needs area 125 126 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 127 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of this section, the 128 full amount that the recipient received under the scholarship 129 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 130 interest. If a loan repayment recipient fails to practice family 131 medicine for a period of eight (8) years in a critical needs area 132 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 133 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (5)(c) of this section, 134 the full amount that the recipient received for loan repayments 135 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 136 interest. The amount of interest due shall be equal to the annual rate of return on the Health Care Trust Fund established under 137 Section 43-13-405 for each year from the time the recipient 138 139 received the scholarship or loan repayment money until the time 140 the scholarship or loan repayment money is repaid. The board of 141 trustees may bring suit against any scholarship or loan repayment 142 recipient to recover the amount due to the state under this 143 section for the recipient's failure to comply with the conditions 144 upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was granted, as provided in this section and in the contract between the recipient 145 and the board of trustees. The board of trustees is authorized to 146 postpone or forgive the repayment of all or part of the amount 147 148 that a recipient received under the scholarship or for loan 149 repayments and the interest that would otherwise be due under this

- subsection if the recipient's failure to comply with the

  conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was

  granted was due to circumstances beyond the recipient's control

  that caused the recipient to be physically unable to comply with
- 154 those conditions, such as suffering a severe illness, injury or
- 155 other disabling condition.
- 156 (7) The board of trustees shall establish such rules and
- 157 regulations, based upon recommendations submitted by the Medical
- 158 <u>Care Critical Needs Committee</u>, which it deems necessary and proper
- 159 to carry out the purposes and intent of this section.
- 160 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 161 and after July 1, 2001.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-143-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO EXPAND THE MEDICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO INCLUDE A 3 LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM FOR FAMILY MEDICINE PHYSICIANS AGREEING TO SERVE IN A PRIMARY CARE CRITICAL NEEDS SHORTAGE AREA, TO AUTHORIZE 5 THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO USE FUNDS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE SCHOLARSHIP AND LOAN REPAYMENT 6 7 PROGRAM TO SECURE FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS TO ASSIST IN REPAYING EDUCATIONAL LOANS FOR PRIMARY HEALTH CARE CLINICIANS AGREEING TO 8 9 PRACTICE IN PRIMARY CARE CRITICAL NEEDS SHORTAGE AREAS, AND TO 10 REQUIRE NO LESS THAN EIGHT YEARS SERVICE IN EXCHANGE FOR LOAN
- 11 REPAYMENTS THROUGH THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
