HOUSE BILL NO. 737

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 71-3-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT APPEALS FROM THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION SHALL BE TO THE COURT OF APPEALS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 71-3-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 71-3-51. The final award of the commission shall be
- 8 conclusive and binding unless either party to the controversy
- 9 shall, within thirty (30) days from the date of its filing in the
- 10 office of the commission and notification to the parties, appeal
- 11 therefrom to the Court of Appeals.
- 12 Such appeal may be taken by filing notice of appeal with the
- 13 commission, whereupon the commission shall under its certificate
- 14 transmit to the Court of Appeals all documents and papers on file
- 15 in the matter, together with a transcript of the evidence, the
- 16 findings, and award, which shall thereupon become the record of
- 17 the cause. Appeals shall be considered only upon the record as
- 18 made before the commission. The Court of Appeals shall always be
- 19 deemed open for hearing of such appeals * * *. The Court of
- 20 Appeals shall review all questions of law and of fact. If no
- 21 prejudicial error be found, the matter shall be affirmed and
- 22 remanded to the commission for enforcement. If prejudicial error
- 23 be found, the same shall be reversed and the $\underline{\text{Court of Appeals}}$
- 24 shall enter such judgment or award as the commission should have
- 25 entered. Appeals may be taken from the Court of Appeals to the
- 26 Supreme Court in the manner as now required by law. An appeal
- 27 from the commission to the Court of Appeals shall not act as a

28	supersedeas unless the court to which such appeal is directed
29	shall so direct, and then upon such terms as such court shall
30	direct.

31	No controversy shall be heard by the commission or an award
32	of compensation made therein while the same matter is pending
33	either before a federal court or in any court in this state.
34	Any award of compensation made by the Court of Appeals and
35	appealed to the Supreme Court shall bear the same interest and

penalties as do other judgments awarded in the Court of Appeals.
