HOUSE BILL NO. 986

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-36-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO ESTABLISH A LIMITED TIME PERIOD WITHIN WHICH A PERSON WITH
CERTAIN QUALIFICATIONS MAY BE ISSUED A LICENSE AS A REGISTERED
FORESTER; TO AMEND SECTION 73-36-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
DISALLOW CRIMINAL PROSECUTIONS OF THOSE QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS
UNTIL THE EXPIRATION OF THE LIMITED TIME PERIOD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-36-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 73-36-21. (1) Any person who has graduated with a
- 12 bachelor's degree or higher degree from a university or college of
- 13 forestry in a curriculum in forestry acceptable to the board and
- 14 found by the board to be substantially equivalent to curricula in
- 15 schools of forestry accredited by the Society of American
- 16 Foresters shall be eligible for registration as a registered
- 17 forester, and a license shall be issued upon application and
- 18 payment of the required fee, if the person files an application
- 19 for registration with the board and successfully passes a written
- 20 and/or oral examination.
- 21 (2) From the effective date of this act until sixty (60)
- 22 days have elapsed following that date, any person who has been
- 23 engaged in the occupation of forester for twenty (20) consecutive
- 24 years and who is a high school graduate shall be issued a license
- 25 as a registered forester, upon application and payment of the
- 26 required fee to the board. The board may not require such a
- 27 person to possess any other qualification, including an additional
- 28 educational degree or the successful completion of any written or
- 29 oral examination. Proof of engaging in the occupation of forester

- 30 may consist of affidavits submitted by the applicant and one or
- 31 more other person(s) having knowledge of the applicant's
- 32 experience as a forester. Upon submission of such proof, the
- 33 board does not have discretion to deny a license during the
- 34 limited period of time specified in this subsection. The
- 35 provisions of this subsection shall be repealed sixty-one (61)
- 36 days after the effective date of this act.
- 37 SECTION 2. Section 73-36-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 38 amended as follows:
- 39 73-36-35. (1) Any person who practices or offers to
- 40 practice the profession of forestry in this state as a registered
- 41 forester without being registered in accordance with this chapter,
- 42 or any person who uses in connection with his name, or otherwise
- 43 assumes, uses or advertises any title or description tending to
- 44 convey the impression that he is a registered forester without
- 45 being registered in accordance with this chapter, or any person
- 46 who presents or attempts to use as his own the license of another,
- 47 or any person who gives any false or forged evidence of any kind
- 48 to the board or any member in obtaining a license, or any person
- 49 who attempts to use an expired or revoked license, or any person,
- 50 firm, partnership or corporation who violates any of the
- 51 provisions of this chapter and has not been issued an
- 52 administrative fine by the board for the violation is guilty of a
- 53 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than
- 54 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each violation. The board,
- or any person or persons as may be designated by the board to act
- 56 in its stead, is empowered to prefer charges for any violations of
- 57 this chapter in any court of competent jurisdiction. It shall be
- 58 the duty of all duly constituted officers of the law of this state
- 59 to enforce the provisions of this chapter and to prosecute any
- 60 persons, firms, partnerships or corporations violating same. The
- 61 Attorney General of the state or his designated assistant shall



62	act as legal advisor of the board and render such assistance as
63	may be necessary in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.
64	(2) Until sixty (60) days have elapsed from the effective
65	date of this act, a person may not be prosecuted for violations of
66	this act if he has met the qualifications specified in Section
67	73-36-21(2) or has applied to be licensed as a registered forester
68	under that provision. The provisions of this subsection shall be
69	repealed sixty-one (61) days after the effective date of this act.
70	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
71	and after its passage.
