SENATE BILL NO. 2453

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 13-5-1, 13-5-4 AND 13-5-8,  
2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT JURY SELECTION SHALL BE  
3 MADE FROM AMONG THOSE QUALIFIED PERSONS WHO HOLD MISSISSIPPI  
4 DRIVERS' LICENSES RATHER THAN FROM QUALIFIED ELECTORS; TO REQUIRE  
5 THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO FURNISH LISTS OF DRIVER'S  
6 LICENSE HOLDERS TO JURY COMMISSIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

8 **SECTION 1.** Section 13-5-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
9 amended as follows:

10 13-5-1. Every citizen not under the age of twenty-one (21)  
11 years, who possesses a driver's license or identification card  
12 issued by the Department of Public Safety or who has executed the  
13 affidavit prescribed in Section 13-5-8(2)(b); has been a resident  
14 of his respective county for more than one (1) year; is able to  
15 read and write; \* \* \* has not been convicted of an infamous crime,  
16 or the unlawful sale of intoxicating liquors within a period of  
17 five (5) years; and \* \* \* is not a common gambler or habitual  
18 drunkard, is a competent juror. No person who is or has been  
19 within twelve (12) months the overseer of a public road or road  
20 contractor shall, however, be competent to serve as a grand juror.  
21 The lack of any such qualifications on the part of one or more  
22 jurors shall not \* \* \* vitiate an indictment or verdict.  
23 Moreover, no talesman or tales juror shall be qualified who has  
24 served as such talesman or tales juror in the last preceding two  
25 (2) years, and no juror shall serve on any jury who has served as  
26 such for the last preceding two (2) years. No juror shall serve  
27 who has a case of his own pending in that court, provided there  
28 are sufficient qualified jurors in the district, and for trial at  
29 that term.



30 In order to determine that prospective jurors can read and  
31 write, the presiding judge shall, with the assistance of the  
32 clerk, distribute to the jury panel a form to be completed  
33 personally by each juror prior to being empaneled as follows:

44 The judge shall personally examine the answers of each juror  
45 prior to empanelling the jury and each juror who cannot complete  
46 the above form shall be disqualified as a juror and discharged.

47 A list of any jurors disqualified for jury duty by reason of  
48 inability to complete the form shall be kept by the circuit clerk  
49 and their names shall not be placed in the jury box thereafter  
50 until such person can qualify as above provided.

51 **SECTION 2.** Section 13-5-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
52 amended as follows:

53 13-5-4. As used in this chapter:

54 (a) "Court" means the circuit, chancery and county  
55 courts of this state and includes, when the context requires, any  
56 judge of the court.

57 (b) "Clerk" and "clerk of the court" means the circuit  
58 clerk of the county and any deputy clerk.

59 (c) "Master list" means the \* \* \* lists for the county  
60 provided by the Department of Public Safety pursuant to Section  
61 13-5-8, Mississippi Code of 1972.

63           (d) "Jury wheel" means any physical device or  
64 electronic system for the storage of the names or identifying  
65 numbers of prospective jurors.

66           (e) "Jury box" means the jury wheel in which is placed  
67 the names or identifying numbers of prospective jurors whose names  
68 are drawn at random from the jury wheel and who are not  
69 disqualified.

70           (f) "Senior judge" means the circuit or chancery judge,  
71 as the case may be, who has the longest continuous service on the  
72 court in a particular judicial district which has more than one  
73 (1) such judge, or if the judges are equal in time of service,  
74 then the judge who has been engaged for the longest time  
75 continuously in the practice of law in this state.

76           **SECTION 3.** Section 13-5-8, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
77 amended as follows:

78           13-5-8. (1) By April of each year, the jury commission for  
79 each county shall compile and maintain a master list consisting of  
80 the \* \* \* list for the county provided by the Department of Public  
81 Safety pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

82           (2) (a) On or before January 1, 2003, and by January 1 of  
83 each year thereafter, the Department of Public Safety shall  
84 deliver to the jury commission for each county a list of names,  
85 along with mailing addresses and dates of birth, of each person  
86 twenty-one (21) years of age or older whose name appears in the  
87 driver's license database of the department and whose address is  
88 in that county. From and after July 1, 2002, the department shall  
89 begin the process of identifying persons whose names appear in  
90 such database who are not citizens of the United States and legal  
91 residents of this state for the purpose of jury selection. By  
92 January 1, 2009, the database list delivered to the jury  
93 commission for each county may include only the names of persons  
94 who are citizens of the United States and legal residents of  
95 Mississippi and whose address is in that county and who are



96 twenty-one (21) years of age or older. The jury commission shall  
97 add to the list the name of any person who is twenty-one (21)  
98 years of age or older and who is a citizen of the United States  
99 and a legal resident of Mississippi and who indicates a desire to  
100 serve as a juror, but whose name does not appear on the database  
101 list, by requiring such person to execute an affidavit.

102 (b) The affidavit executed pursuant to paragraph (a)  
103 must be in substantially the following form:

104 "State of Mississippi

119 **SECTION 4.** Sections 2 and 3 of this act shall take effect  
120 and be in force from and after July 1, 2002; Section 1 of this act  
121 shall take effect and be in force from and after January 1, 2003.
