#### COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2890

AN ACT TO CREATE A NEW CODE SECTION TO BE CODIFIED AS SECTION 67-3-74, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL DIVISION OF THE STATE 3 TAX COMMISSION TO ASSIST IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE LAW REGULATING LIGHT WINE AND BEER; TO AMEND SECTION 67-3-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE STATE TAX COMMISSION MAY REVOKE OR SUSPEND A PERMIT OF A RETAILER FOR THE 7 SALE OF LIGHT WINE OR BEER TO A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 21 ONLY 8 UNTIL THERE HAS BEEN A CONVICTION OF THE PERMIT HOLDER OR AN 9 EMPLOYEE OF THE PERMIT HOLDER FOR SUCH SALE; TO AMEND SECTIONS 10 67-1-81, 67-3-69 AND 67-3-70, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE 11 THAT A TRIAL JUDGE SHALL SUSPEND THE DRIVER'S LICENSE OF A MINOR 12 WHO UNLAWFULLY POSSESSES OR PURCHASES ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, BEER OR 13 LIGHT WINE IN LIEU OF CONVICTION FOR SUCH OFFENSES; TO PROVIDE 14 THAT THE JUDGE MAY PLACE THE MINOR ON PROBATION DURING THE PERIOD 15 OF THE DRIVER'S LICENSE SUSPENSION, SUBJECT SUCH CONDITIONS AS THE 16 JUDGE DEEMS APPROPRIATE; TO INCREASE THE PENALTY FOR POSSESSION OF 17 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, LIGHT WINE OR BEER; TO INCREASE THE PENALTY FOR UNLAWFUL SALE OF LIGHT WINE OR BEER; TO AMEND SECTIONS 18 19 67-1-37, 67-3-31 AND 67-3-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN 20 CONFORMITY THERETO; TO PROVIDE THAT THE ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY GRANTED TO OFFICERS OF THE DIVISION SHALL BE REPEALED ON JULY 1, 21 22 2002; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2.3

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 25 **SECTION 1.** The following provision shall be codified as
- 27 67-3-74. (1) In addition to peace officers within their

Section 67-3-74, Mississippi Code of 1972:

- 28 jurisdiction, all enforcement officers of the Alcoholic Beverage
- 29 Control Division of the State Tax Commission are authorized to
- 30 enforce the provisions made unlawful by Sections 67-3-13, 67-3-15,
- 31 67-3-53 and 67-3-70; provided, however, that the provisions
- 32 prohibiting the sale of light wine or beer to persons under the
- 33 age of twenty-one (21) years shall be enforced by the division as
- 34 provided for in this section.
- 35 (2) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Division shall
- 36 investigate violations of the laws prohibiting the sale of light
- 37 wine or beer to persons under the age of twenty-one (21) years

- upon receipt of a complaint or information from a person stating 38 that they have knowledge of such violation. Upon receipt of such 39 complaint or information, the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division 40 shall notify the permit holder of the complaint by certified mail 41 42 to the primary business office of such permit holder or by hand 43 delivery of the complaint or information to the primary business office of such holder, except in cases where the complaint or 44 information is received from any law enforcement officer. If an 45 enforcement officer of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division 46 enters the business of the holder of the permit to investigate a 47 complaint and discovers a violation, the agent shall notify the 48 person that committed the violation before he leaves such 49
- 50 business. (3) The provisions of this section shall be repealed on July 51 1, 2003. 52
- SECTION 2. Section 67-3-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 53 54 amended as follows:
- 55 67-3-29. (1) The commissioner shall revoke any permit granted by authority of this chapter to any person who shall 56 57 violate any of the provisions of this chapter or the revenue laws of this state relating to engaging in transporting, storing, 58 59 selling, distributing, possessing, receiving or manufacturing of wines or beers, or any person who shall hereafter be convicted of 60 the unlawful sale of intoxicating liquor, or any person who shall 61 allow or permit any form of illegal gambling or immorality on the 62 premises described in such permit. The commissioner shall not 63 64 revoke or suspend a permit of a retailer for the sale of light wine or beer to a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years
- until there has been a conviction of the permit holder or an 66
- employee of the permit holder for such violation. 67
- If any person exercising any privilege taxable under the 68 69 provisions of Chapter 71 of Title 27, Mississippi Code of 1972, 70 shall willfully neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of

Any person under the age of twenty-one (21) who 139 140 knowingly makes a false statement to the effect that he or she is 141 twenty-one (21) years old or older to any person engaged in the sale of alcoholic beverages for the purpose of obtaining the same 142 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine 143 of not <u>less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five</u> 144 145 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and a sentence to not more than thirty (30) days' community service. 146 147 (3) The term "community service" as used in this section shall mean work, projects or services for the benefit of the 148 149 community assigned, supervised and recorded by appropriate public 150 officials. (4) If a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years is 151 convicted or enters a plea of guilty of purchasing, receiving or 152 having in his or her possession in any public place any alcoholic 153 154 beverages in violation of subsection (2) of this section, the trial judge, in lieu of the penalties otherwise provided under 155 156 subsection (2) of this section, shall suspend the minor's driver's license by taking and keeping it in the custody of the court for a 157 158 period of time not to exceed ninety (90) days. The judge so 159 ordering the suspension shall enter upon his docket "DEFENDANT'S DRIVER'S LICENSE SUSPENDED FOR DAYS IN LIEU OF CONVICTION" 160 161 and such action by the trial judge shall not constitute a conviction. During the period that the minor's driver's license 162 163 is suspended, the trial judge shall suspend the imposition of any fines or penalties that may be imposed under subsection (2) of 164 this section and may place the minor on probation subject to such 165 conditions as the judge deems appropriate. If the minor violates 166 any of the conditions of probation, then the trial judge shall 167 168 return the driver's license to the minor and impose the fines,

- penalties or both, that he would have otherwise imposed, and such
- 170 <u>action shall constitute a conviction.</u>
- SECTION 4. Section 67-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 172 amended as follows:
- 173 67-3-69. (1) Except as to Sections 67-3-17, 67-3-23,
- 174 67-3-27, 67-3-55 and 67-3-57, any violation of any provision of
- 175 this chapter or of any rule or regulation of the commissioner,

- 210 any other penalty provided for by law, the holder of the permit,
- 211 or employee of the holder of a permit, may be punished as follows:
- 212 (a) For the first offense on the licensed
- 213 premises, \* \* \* by a fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars
- 214 (\$200.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) and/or
- 215 the sale of beer or wine on the premises from which the sale
- 216 occurred may be prohibited for three (3) months.
- 217 (b) For a second offense occurring on the licensed
- 218 premises within twelve (12) months of the first offense, \* \* \* by
- 219 a fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more
- 220 than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) and/or the
- 221 sale of beer or wine on the premises from which the sale occurred
- 222 may be prohibited for six (6) months.
- (c) For a third or subsequent offense occurring on the
- 224 licensed premises within twelve (12) months of the first, \* \* \* by
- 225 a fine of not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more
- 226 than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and/or the sale of beer or
- 227 wine on the premises from which the sale occurred may be
- 228 prohibited for one (1) year.
- 229 (4) A person who sells any beer or wine to a person under
- 230 the age of twenty-one (21) years shall not be guilty of a
- violation of Section 67-3-53(b) if the person under the age of
- 232 twenty-one (21) years represents himself to be twenty-one (21)
- 233 years of age or older by displaying an apparently valid
- 234 Mississippi driver's license containing a physical description

- 235 consistent with his appearance or by displaying some other
- 236 apparently valid identification document containing a picture and
- 237 physical description consistent with his appearance for the
- 238 purpose of inducing the person to sell beer or wine to him.
- 239 (5) If the holder of a permit to operate a brewpub is
- 240 convicted of violating the provisions of Section 67-3-22(3), then,
- 241 in addition to any other provision provided for by law, the holder
- 242 of the permit shall be punished as follows:
- 243 (a) For the first offense, the holder of a permit to
- 244 operate a brewpub may be fined in an amount not to exceed Five
- 245 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).
- 246 (b) For a second offense occurring within twelve (12)
- 247 months of the first offense, the holder of a permit to operate a
- 248 brewpub may be fined an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars
- 249 (\$1,000.00).
- 250 (c) For a third or subsequent offense occurring within
- 251 twelve (12) months of the first offense, the holder of a permit to

- 267 of age or older for the purpose of purchasing or possessing any

  conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than <u>Two</u>

  Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars

  (\$500.00) and \* \* \* a sentence to not more than thirty (30) days

  community service.
- Except as otherwise provided by Section 67-3-54, any 273 274 person who knowingly purchases light wine or beer for, or gives or makes available light wine or beer to a person under the age of 275 twenty-one (21) years, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon 276 conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than Two 277 278 Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and \* \* \* a sentence to not more than thirty (30) days 279 280 community service.
- 281 (4) The term "community service" as used in this section
  282 shall mean work, projects or services for the benefit of the
  283 community assigned, supervised and recorded by appropriate public
  284 officials.
- 285 If a person under the age of twenty-one (21) years is convicted or enters a plea of guilty of violating subsection (1) 286 287 or subsection (2) of this section, the trial judge, in lieu of the penalties otherwise provided under this section, shall suspend the 288 289 minor's driver's license by taking and keeping it in the custody of the court for a period of time not to exceed ninety (90) days. 290 The judge so ordering the suspension shall enter upon his docket 291 292 "DEFENDANT'S DRIVER'S LICENSE SUSPENDED FOR DAYS IN LIEU OF CONVICTION" and such action by the trial judge shall not 293 constitute a conviction. During the period that the minor's 294 driver's license is suspended, the trial judge shall suspend the 295 imposition of any fines or penalties that may be imposed under 296 297 this section and may place the minor on probation subject to such conditions as the judge deems appropriate. If the minor violates 298 299 any of the conditions of probation, then the trial judge shall 300 return the driver's license to the minor and impose the fines,

penalties, or both, that he would have otherwise imposed, and such action shall constitute a conviction.

(6) Any person who has been charged with a violation of 303 304 subsections (1) or (2) of this section may, not sooner than one 305 (1) year after the dismissal and discharge or completion of any 306 sentence and/or payment of any fine, apply to the court for an order to expunge from all official records all recordation 307 relating to his arrest, trial, finding or plea of guilty, and 308 309 dismissal and discharge. If the court determines that such person was dismissed and the proceedings against him discharged or that 310 311 such person had satisfactorily served his sentence and/or paid his fine, it shall enter such order. 312

# [Until July 1, 2003, this section will read as follows:]

67-1-37. The State Tax Commission, under its duties and powers with respect to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division therein, shall have the following powers, functions and duties:

319 (a) To issue or refuse to issue any permit provided for 320 by this chapter, or to extend the permit or remit in whole or any 321 part of the permit monies when the permit cannot be used due to a 322 natural disaster or Act of God.

(b) To revoke, suspend or cancel, for violation of or noncompliance with the provisions of this chapter, or the law governing the production and sale of native wines, or any lawful rules and regulations of the commission issued hereunder, or for other sufficient cause, any permit issued by it under the provisions of this chapter; however, no such permit shall be revoked, suspended or cancelled except after a hearing of which the permit holder shall have been given reasonable notice and an opportunity to be heard. The board shall be authorized to suspend the permit of any permit holder for being out of compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153. The

procedure for suspension of a permit for being out of compliance 334 with an order for support, and the procedure for the reissuance or 335 reinstatement of a permit suspended for that purpose, and the 336 337 payment of any fees for the reissuance or reinstatement of a 338 permit suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or Section 93-11-163, as the case may be. 339 If there is any conflict between any provision of Section 93-11-157 or Section 340 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter, the provisions of 341 Section 93-11-157 or Section 93-11-163, as the case may be, shall 342 343 control.

- 344 (c) To prescribe forms of permits and applications for 345 permits and of all reports which it deems necessary in 346 administering this chapter.
- 347 (d) To fix standards, not in conflict with those 348 prescribed by any law of this state or of the United States, to 349 secure the use of proper ingredients and methods of manufacture of 350 alcoholic beverages.
- (e) To issue rules regulating the advertising of alcoholic beverages in the state in any class of media and permitting advertising of the retail price of alcoholic beverages.
- 354 (f) To issue reasonable rules and regulations, not
  355 inconsistent with the federal laws or regulations, requiring
  356 informative labeling of all alcoholic beverages offered for sale
  357 within this state and providing for the standards of fill and
  358 shapes of retail containers of alcoholic beverages; however, such
  359 containers shall not contain less than fifty (50) milliliters by
  360 liquid measure.
- 361 (g) Subject to the provisions of subsection (3) of
  362 Section 67-1-51, to issue rules and regulations governing the
  363 issuance of retail permits for premises located near or around
  364 schools, colleges, universities, churches and other public
  365 institutions, and specifying the distances therefrom within which
  366 no such permit shall be issued. The alcoholic beverage control

division shall not allow the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages in or on the campus of any public school or college, and no alcoholic beverage shall be for sale or consumed at any public athletic event at any grammar or high school or any college.

- 371 To adopt and promulgate, repeal and amend, such rules, regulations, standards, requirements and orders, not 372 373 inconsistent with this chapter or any law of this state or of the 374 United States, as it deems necessary to control the manufacture, importation, transportation, distribution and sale of alcoholic 375 liquor, whether intended for beverage or nonbeverage use in a 376 377 manner not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter or any other statute, including the native wine laws. 378
- (i) To call upon other administrative departments of
  the state, county and municipal governments, county and city
  police departments and upon prosecuting officers for such
  information and assistance as it may deem necessary in the
  performance of its duties.
- (j) To prepare and submit to the Governor during the
  month of January of each year a detailed report of its official
  acts during the preceding fiscal year ending June 30, including
  such recommendations as it may see fit to make, and to transmit a
  like report to each member of the Legislature of this state upon
  the convening thereof at its next regular session.
- 390 (k) To inspect, or cause to be inspected, any premises
  391 where alcoholic liquors intended for sale are manufactured,
  392 stored, distributed or sold, and to examine or cause to be
  393 examined all books and records pertaining to the business
  394 conducted therein.
- 395 (1) In the conduct of any hearing authorized to be held 396 by the commission, to hear testimony and take proof material for 397 its information in the discharge of its duties under this chapter; 398 to issue subpoenas, which shall be effective in any part of this 399 state, requiring the attendance of witnesses and the production of S. B. No. 2890

books and records; to administer or cause to be administered
oaths; and to examine or cause to be examined any witness under
oath. Any court of record, or any judge thereof, may by order
duly entered require the attendance of witnesses and the
production of relevant books subpoenaed by the commission, and
such court or judge may compel obedience to its or his order by
proceedings for contempt.

- (m) To investigate the administration of laws in relation to alcoholic liquors in this and other states and any foreign countries, and to recommend from time to time to the Governor and through him to the Legislature of this state such amendments to this chapter, if any, as it may think desirable.
- (n) To designate hours and days when alcoholic beverages may be sold in different localities in the state which permit such sale.
- To assign employees to posts of duty at locations 415 (0) where they will be most beneficial for the control of alcoholic 416 417 beverages, to remove, to dismiss, to suspend without pay, to act as a trial board in hearings based upon charges against employees. 418 419 After twelve (12) months' service, no employee shall be removed, dismissed, demoted or suspended without just cause and only after 420 421 being furnished with reasons for such removal, dismissal, demotion 422 or suspension, and upon request given a hearing in his own defense. 423
- 424 (p) All hearings conducted by the commission shall be 425 open to the public, and, when deemed necessary, a written 426 transcript shall be made of the testimony introduced thereat.
- (q) To adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for suspension or revocation of identification cards of employees of permittees for violations of the alcoholic beverage control laws, rules or regulations.

It shall be the duty of all peace officers \* \* \*, within their jurisdiction, and all enforcement officers of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division of the State Tax Commission to enforce the provisions of Section 67-3-53 and they shall frequently visit all licensed premises within their jurisdiction to determine whether such permittees are complying with the laws. They shall promptly investigate all complaints made to them by any citizen relative to any alleged violations of such section within their jurisdiction. When any peace officer or enforcement officer of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division has knowledge of a violation of such section committed by a permittee within his jurisdiction, it shall be his duty forthwith to file an affidavit with the county prosecuting attorney or district attorney requesting that a complaint be filed for the revocation or suspension of the permit of the permittee. 

# [From and after July 1, 2003, this section will read as follows:]

67-3-37. It shall be the duty of the county prosecuting attorney or the district attorney, as the case may be, to file complaints as provided in Section 67-3-31 and to prosecute diligently and without delay all complaints filed by him

It shall be the duty of all peace officers to enforce, within their jurisdiction, the provisions of Section 67-3-53 and they shall frequently visit all licensed premises within their jurisdiction to determine whether such permittees are complying with the laws. They shall promptly investigate all complaints made to them by any citizen relative to any alleged violations of such section within their jurisdiction. When any peace officer has knowledge of a violation of such section committed by a permittee within his jurisdiction, it shall be his duty forthwith to file an affidavit with the county prosecuting attorney or district attorney requesting that a complaint be filed for the revocation or suspension of the permit of the permittee.

SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
