## SENATE BILL NO. 2966

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-21 TO REMOVE REFERENCE TO NONEXISTENT POSITION AND AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MARINE RESOURCES TO SUPERVISE THE RESERVE OFFICER UNIT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-15-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

7 amended as follows:

8 49-15-21. (1) The executive director shall appoint the 9 necessary enforcement officers for the administration of this 10 chapter. The salary of all enforcement officers employed shall be

11 as determined by the State Personnel Board. However, the members

12 of the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit created in subsection

13 (4) shall serve without pay, and shall not be employees of the

14 State of Mississippi for purposes of the State Personnel System,

15 the Workers' Compensation Law, the Public Employees' Retirement

16 System or the State Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan.

17 (2) All enforcement officers shall be experienced and

18 qualified persons thoroughly familiar with the seafood business

19 and shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age and be a high

20 school graduate or its equivalent. The enforcement officers

21 shall diligently enforce all laws and regulations for the

22 protection, propagation, preservation or conservation of all

23 saltwater aquatic life of the State of Mississippi, and they are

24 hereby constituted peace officers of the State of Mississippi,

25 with full police power and jurisdiction to enforce all laws of

26 the State of Mississippi and all regulations adopted and

27 promulgated by the commission. Enforcement officers may

28 exercise such powers in any county of the State of Mississippi

and on any waters of the state, and they are hereby authorized 29 30 to carry firearms or other weapons, concealed or otherwise, and they shall investigate all persons, corporations and otherwise 31 32 who are alleged to have violated any laws, and make affidavits, 33 arrests and serve papers of any court of competent jurisdiction, 34 in like manner as is provided for sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, when the same shall be in connection with the enforcement of the 35 seafood laws of the State of Mississippi and such other laws and 36 regulations of this state as the commission may designate. 37 enforcement officers may seize at any time aquatic life caught, 38 39 taken or transported in a manner contrary to the laws of this state, and may confiscate and dispose of the same. Any net or 40 other paraphernalia used or employed in connection with a 41 violation may be seized, and forfeiture proceedings may be 42 instituted \* \* \*. Enforcement officers may draft the aid of 43 captains, crews and boats or licensed vessels to enforce this 44 chapter and may, without warrant, board and search vessels or 45 46 vehicles. The application for any license or permit from the commission to catch, fish, take, transport or handle or process 47 48 any form of aquatic life, or the taking, catching, transporting or handling or processing of any and all aquatic life in this 49 50 state shall constitute acquiescence and agreement upon the part of the owners, captains and crews, employers and dealers to the 51 provisions of this chapter and the agreement that enforcement 52 53 officers may exercise the authority granted under the provisions hereof. 54

(3) Prior to entering into performance of their duties or delegations or as soon after appointment as possible, each enforcement officer, at the expense of the commission, shall attend and complete an appropriate curriculum in the field of law enforcement at the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy or other law enforcement training program approved under Section 45-6-7. However, members of the Enforcement Officers'

Reserve Unit created in subsection (4) of this section may attend 62 the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training Academy at the 63 expense of the commission if it deems the training necessary or 64 65 desirable. No enforcement officer shall be entitled to payment of 66 salary after the first six (6) months in office if he has either 67 failed to attend the academy or has failed to comply with other qualifications or successfully complete any law enforcement 68 qualification examinations as the director deems necessary. 69 enforcement officers shall, on a periodic basis, be required to 70 attend additional advanced courses in law enforcement in order 71 72 that they will be properly improved and trained in the modern,

There is hereby created an Enforcement Officers' 74 (a) Reserve Unit, hereinafter termed "the reserve," to assist the 75 enforcement officers in the performance of their duties under this 76 The reserve shall consist of volunteers who are approved 77 chapter. by the Executive Director of the Department of Marine Resources, 78 79 or his designee. \* \* \* The members of the reserve shall serve without pay. Reserve officers shall be in such numbers as 80 81 determined by the enforcement needs, with the maximum strength of reserve officers limited to the same number as enforcement 82 officers.

- To be eligible for membership in the reserve, an (b) 84 applicant must be twenty-one (21) years of age, be a high school 85 graduate or its equivalent, be in good physical condition, have a 86 Mississippi driver's license, be in good standing with the 87 88 community, be available for training and duty, not be a member of any police, auxiliary police, civil defense, or private security 89 agency, have never been convicted of a felony, and have one (1) of 90 the following: 91
- 92 (i) An honorable discharge or honorable separation 93 certificate from one (1) of the United States military services;

(ii) Three (3) years of responsible post-high 94 school work experience that required the ability to deal 95 effectively with individuals and groups of persons; 96 97 (iii) Successful completion of sixty (60) semester 98 hours at an accredited college or university; or (iv) The qualifications as are outlined in this 99 100 section for enforcement officers. Members of the immediate family of enforcement officers shall 101 102 not be eligible for the reserve unless a special waiver is 103 granted. 104 Upon acceptance into the reserve, members shall receive a temporary appointment for one (1) year. During this year of 105 temporary status, members must successfully complete the required 106 107 training and must qualify on the same firearms course as enforcement officers. 108 The reserve shall be under the leadership and 109 direction of the executive director, or his designee. 110 111 training of the reserve shall be conducted by an enforcement officer. The reserve shall meet at least once each month for the 112 113 purpose of training and transacting any business as may come before it. The executive director shall be notified in writing of 114 all meetings of the reserve and the time and place of the meetings 115 116 shall be recorded with the executive director. The executive director shall prepare a reserve officer's manual with the advice 117 118 and consent of the commission. The manual shall include, but is not limited to, the following: activities and operations, 119 training, administration and duties. During active service, the 120 reserve shall be under the direction of the executive director, or 121 his designated representative. When a reserve officer is on 122 123 active duty and assigned to a specific enforcement officer, he shall be under the direct supervision of that officer. Reserve 124 125 officers serve at the discretion of the executive director and may

be dismissed by him \* \* \*. Reserve officers shall furnish their

- own uniforms and other personal equipment if the <u>executive</u>
  director does not provide such items.
- (d) The <u>executive director</u> may \* \* \* require members of the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit to attend officer reserve training programs conducted by county or municipal agencies.
- (e) The <u>executive director</u> may issue uniforms to such reserve officers and may authorize the issuance of any state equipment necessary for the reserve officers to adequately assist law enforcement officers. The <u>executive director may</u> develop a reserve officer identification system to accomplish the issuance of such items in accordance with the State Auditor guidelines.
  - of the Enforcement Officers' Reserve Unit may attend a training program as authorized under this section, it shall require that reserve officer to sign an agreement, prior to attending a training program, which shall stipulate that if the reserve officer accepts employment from any other public or private law enforcement agency within three (3) years after completion of his training program, the reserve officer or the respective hiring law enforcement agency shall reimburse the department for the total cost of his training program. By October 1 of each year, the department shall provide the Conservation and Water Resources

    Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Ports and Marine Resources Committee of the Mississippi Senate a listing which contains each name and the respective cost of training each reserve officer received during the previous year.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
