- WHEREAS, Lester Herrington has announced he will retire from 6
- 7 his position as Deputy Commissioner of the Mississippi State Tax
- Commission effective after the 2002 Regular Session; and 8
- 9 WHEREAS, Lester Herrington has held the position of Deputy
- Commissioner of the Mississippi Tax Commission since December 1, 10
- 1984 and also serves as liaison for the Tax Commission with the 11
- Legislature, and has served on the Executive Committee of the 12
- Southeastern Association of tax Administrators since 1985; and 13
- 14 WHEREAS, beginning his career with the Tax Commission in
- 1966, Herrington was an auditor in the Greenwood District for six 15
- years and was then Manager of the Tupelo District office for 10 16
- years. On March 1, 1982, Lester became Assistant Director of 17
- Revenue in the Jackson office, and two years later Administrative 18
- 19 Assistant to the Deputy Commissioner, a position he held until
- assuming his present position as Deputy Commissioner; and 20
- WHEREAS, in January 1992, Lester was appointed by Governor 21
- 22 Ray Mabus to the Board of Trustees for the Public Employees'
- 23 Retirement System for the State of Mississippi for the term ending
- June 30, 1993. On July 1, 1993, Lester was reappointed to a 24
- four-year term by Governor Kirk Fordice. From October 1995 to 25
- June 30, 1997, he served as Chairman of the Board for PERS. On 26
- 27 July 1, 1997, Lester was reappointed to another four-year term by
- 28 Governor Kirk Fordice. In April 1993, he was appointed to the

- Delta State University Accounting Advisory Board. 29 Lester was
- 30 selected to serve on the Mississippi State University Advisory
- In July 2001, Lester was elected to 31 Council in October 1998.
- serve as President for the Southern Region of the American 32
- 33 Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators and in August 2001, he
- 34 was elected to serve on the International Board of Directors for
- AAMVA at their annual conference in Nashville, Tennessee; and 35
- WHEREAS, on April 8, 2000, Lester was inducted into the 36
- Mississippi Delta Community College Sports Hall of Fame. 37 Lester
- graduated from Delta State University with a B.S. degree in 38
- accounting and served as President of the DSU Accounting Alumni 39
- Association from 1999-2000. In the spring of 1999, Lester was 40
- selected to become a member of Omicron Delta Kappa; and 41
- WHEREAS, Lester's legacy of work with the Legislature on 42
- behalf of the Mississippi State Tax Commission has been 43
- exemplified by sound judgment, firmness and impartiality, and he 44
- 45 has given this most important state agency a statewide reputation
- for credibility and respect; and 46
- WHEREAS, a native of Ruleville, Mississippi, Lester is 47
- married to the former Bette Bowman of Ruleville, and they have one 48
- son, Les and a grandson, Lester C. Herrington, III (Trey); and 49
