- 5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 6
- the following amendment to the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, 7
- is proposed to the qualified electors of the state: 8
- 9 Amend Section 153, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 10 as follows:
- Section 153. The judges of the circuit and chancery courts 11
- shall be elected by the people in a manner and at a time to be 12
- provided by the Legislature and the judges shall hold their office 13
- for a term of six (6) years. 14
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be 15
- submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 16
- an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday 17
- of November 2002, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution 18
- and by general law. 19
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed 20
- amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed 21
- constitutional amendment will increase the terms of judges of the 22
- 23 circuit and chancery courts to six years."
