- 18 WHEREAS, former library trustee, Betty McKenzie, credits
- 19 Pridgen's leadership not only in bringing the series of humanities
- 20 programs to the city, but as the catalyst in the 1996 opening of
- 21 the new library which has made the system so successful; and
