SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 46

- A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO SUPPORT AND WORK FOR THE PERMANENT REPEAL
- 3 OF THE DEATH TAX.
- WHEREAS, under tax relief legislation passed in 2001, the
- 5 death tax was temporarily phased out, not permanently eliminated;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, women and minorities are very often owners of small
- 8 and medium-sized businesses, and the death tax prevents their
- 9 children from reaping the rewards of a lifetime trying to make a
- 10 better life; and
- 11 WHEREAS, farmers will face losing their farms if the federal
- 12 government resumes the heavy taxation of the estates of people who
- 13 invested most of their earnings back into their farms; and
- 14 WHEREAS, employees suffer when they lose their jobs because
- 15 many small and medium-sized businesses are liquidated to pay death
- 16 taxes and because high capital costs depress the number of new
- 17 businesses that could offer them a job; and
- 18 WHEREAS, if the estate tax had been repealed in 1996, over
- 19 the next nine years the United States' economy would have averaged
- 20 as much as \$11 Billion per year in extra output, and an average of
- 21 145,000 additional new jobs would have been created; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the persistent uncertainty created by the sunset
- 23 provision prevents families and small businesses from taking
- 24 advantage of the repeal; and
- 25 WHEREAS, having passed both the United States House of
- 26 Representatives and the United States Senate, elimination of the
- 27 death tax has proven to hold wide bipartisan support:

- 29 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby request our elected representatives
- 30 in the United States Congress to support and work for the
- 31 permanent repeal of the death tax.

- 34 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
