We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

- H. B. No. 1785: Appropriation; State Forestry Commission.
 - We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:
 - 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
 - 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003

11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003
18	\$ 11,085,486.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,

Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget 67 Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 68 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, 69 for the period of July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, and 70 January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 71 72 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 73 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 74 75 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for "Personal Services," as annualized on a semi-annual basis in 76 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 77 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 78 79 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 80 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 81 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce 82 the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 83 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as 84 the requirements of this provision are met. 85 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 86 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. 87 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 88 89 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 90 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 91 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 92 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 93 94 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds

generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated

from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount

not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00).

- 144 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used
- 145 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme
- 146 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.
- 147 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds
- 148 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written
- 149 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal
- 150 Officer.
- 151 <u>SECTION 7.</u> It is the intention of the State Legislature that
- 152 as soon as funds come available that the Forestry Commission
- 153 Career Ladder be implemented.
- 154 **SECTION 8.** The Forestry Commission has the authority to

- 166 suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or
- 167 other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire
- 168 suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle
- 169 maintenance or repair.
