# Amend by striking all after the resolving clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6	That the following amendment to the Mississippi Constitution
7	of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the state:
8	Amend Section 153, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
9	as follows:
10	"Section 153. The judges of the circuit and chancery courts
11	shall be elected by the people in a manner and at a time to be
12	provided by the Legislature. The judges <u>elected for a term of</u>
13	office beginning before January 1, 2007, shall hold their office
14	for a term of four (4) years. The judges elected for a term of
15	office beginning from and after January 1, 2007, shall hold their
16	office for a term of six (6) years."
17	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be
18	submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at
19	an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday
20	of November 2003, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution
21	and by general law.
22	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
23	amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed

constitutional amendment increases the terms of office of circuit

and chancery court judges from four to six years beginning January

- 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Attorney General of the
- 28 State of Mississippi shall submit this resolution, immediately
- 29 upon adoption by the Legislature, to the Attorney General of the

- 32 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

- 3 CIRCUIT COURT JUDGES AND CHANCELLORS FROM FOUR TO SIX YEARS
- 4 BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2007; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
