HOUSE BILL NO. 1443

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-36, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE THE COMPENSATION FOR JUSTICE COURT JUDGES TO BE BASED UPON 2 POPULATION ACCORDING TO THE 2000 FEDERAL DECENNIAL CENSUS; AND FOR 3
- 4 RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 25-3-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- amended as follows: 7
- 25-3-36. (1) From and after the effective date of House 8
- Bill No. , 2003 Regular Session, every justice court judge 9
- shall receive as full compensation for his or her services * * * 10
- an annual salary based upon the population of his or her county 11
- according to the 2000 federal decennial census; however, no 12
- justice court judge shall be paid less than the salary authorized 13
- under this section to be paid the justice court judge based upon 14
- the population of the county according to the 1990 federal 15
- decennial census. The amount of the salary shall be determined as 16
- follows: 17
- In counties with a population of more than two 18
- hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Two 19
- Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$46,299.00). 20
- In counties with a population of more than one 21

- 49 (i) In counties with a population of more than twelve
- 50 thousand (12,000) but not more than sixteen thousand five hundred
- 51 (16,500), a salary of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen
- 52 Dollars (\$18,216.00).
- (j) In counties with a population of more than eight
- 54 thousand (8,000) but not more than twelve thousand (12,000), a
- 55 salary of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).
- 56 (k) In counties with a population of eight thousand
- 57 (8,000) or less, a salary of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00).
- The board of supervisors of any county having two (2)
- 59 judicial districts and two (2) justice court judges for the county
- 60 shall pay each justice court judge an amount equal to that * * *
- 61 provided in this subsection for judges in the next higher

In any county having a 71 72 population greater than ten thousand (10,000) but less than ten 73 thousand five hundred (10,500) according to the 1990 federal 74 decennial census and in which Mississippi Highway 3 and 75 Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, the board of supervisors * * *, 76 in its discretion, may pay the justice court judges an additional 77 amount not to exceed One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars 78 (\$1,450.00) per year * * *. In any county having a population 79 greater than twenty-four thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less than twenty-four thousand nine hundred (24,900), according to the 80 81 1990 federal census, in which Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 82 intersect, the board of supervisors shall pay the justice court 83 judge an additional amount equal to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year. 84 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this 85 section, if the number of justice court judges authorized under 86 Section 9-11-2(1) is exceeded under the provisions of Section 87 88 9-11-2(4), the aggregate of the salaries paid to the justice court judges of such a county shall not exceed the amount sufficient to 89 pay the number of justice court judges authorized under Section 90 9-11-2(1), and that amount shall be equally divided among those 91 92 justice court judges continuing to hold office under the 93 provisions of Section 9-11-2(4).

- From and after January 1, 1984, all fees, costs, fines 94 and penalties charged and collected in the justice court shall be 95 paid to the clerk of the justice court for deposit, along with 96 97 monies from cash bonds and other monies that have been forfeited 98 in criminal cases, into the general fund of the county as provided in Section 9-11-19; and the clerk of the board of 99 supervisors * * *, upon approval by the board of supervisors, may 100 make disbursements and withdrawals from the general fund of the 101 102 county in order to pay any reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in complying with this section, including payment of the 103 104 salaries of justice court judges as provided by subsection (1) of this section. The provisions of this subsection shall not, except 105 106 as to cash bonds and other monies that have been forfeited in 107 criminal cases, apply to monies required to be deposited in the justice court clerk clearing account as provided in Section 108 9-11-18. 109
- The salaries provided for in subsection (1) of this 110 (4)111 section shall be payable monthly by warrant drawn by the clerk of the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county; 112 113 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its minutes, may provide that the salaries shall be 114 115 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. Ιf a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments 116 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 117 118 legal holiday.
- 119 (5) * * * The salary of <u>a</u> justice court judge shall not be 120 reduced during his term of office as a result of a population 121 change following a federal decennial census.
- (6) Any justice court judge who is unable to attend and hold court by reason of being under suspension by the Commission on Judicial Performance or the Mississippi Supreme Court shall not receive a salary while under that suspension.
