1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2004.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004
10	\$ 10,322,239.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004
18	\$ 47,612,927.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004 \$5,750,000.00.
24	The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25	amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26	sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
27	other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside

28	from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
29	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
30	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
31	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
32	1972.
33	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
34	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
35	authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2003.
36	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
37	Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and
38	Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand
39	Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived
40	from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections
41	27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose
42	of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2003.
43	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
44	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
45	authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
46	Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty
47	Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation,
48	protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and
49	wildlife of this state.
50	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
51	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
52	be expended for the respective major objects of such divisions:

154	regulations to permit the building, equipment and facilities of
155	the Mississippi Museum of Natural Science, or any portion thereof,

groups or entities for special events, occasions or activities.
Such rules and regulations may authorize the commission to
establish and collect reasonable fees and charges for the use of
such building, equipment and facilities, shall authorize such
building, equipment and facilities to be used for such purposes
during the regular operating hours of the museum as well as after
regular operating hours or at other times when such use will not
unreasonably interfere with access to the museum by the general
public, may require users to provide security in the form of cash
deposits, bond and/or insurance for the care and safekeeping of
the building, equipment and facilities, may require users to enter
into indemnity agreements to protect the state, its agencies and
its officers and employees from liability and may authorize the
commission to establish such other terms, conditions, restrictions
and limitations from time to time as the commission deems
advisable with regard to the use of the museum and its building,
equipment and facilities.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 190 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 191 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 192 193 Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2004 194 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2005 budget by the 195 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 196 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 197 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 198 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 199 200 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 201 202 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2004 appropriation for "Personal 203 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 204 205 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2004 "Personal Services" 206 207 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 208 209 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 210 211 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may 212 transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both 213 214 funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of 215 216 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget 217 Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or 218 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of 219 220 the transfer. 221 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

248	SECTION 7. The board of supervisors of any county or any
249	group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and
250	empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and
251	with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the
252	purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and
253	fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within
254	such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is
255	empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not

exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the 256 general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall 257 reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the 258 259 actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by 260 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and 261 empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary 262 to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the 263 264 United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for 265 266 such purposes.

SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 267 268 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 269 270 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House 271 and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 272 273 Fish Committee and Chairman of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal 274 275 year.

SECTION 9. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River
Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of
an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett
Reservoir.

The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for this purpose.

SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for

288 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of

289 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

290 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles

291 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply

292 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

293 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the

294 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the

295 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not

296 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may

297 become available to the department in accordance with the rules

298 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

299 None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to

increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and

301 Fringe Benefits."

302 **SECTION 12.** In order to be in compliance with Sections

303 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be

304 expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay

305 the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees

306 and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the

course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold

308 a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

309 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the

310 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the

311 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi

312 Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars

313 (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi

314 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of

315 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.

316 **SECTION 14.** Of the funds provided herein, One Hundred Fifty

317 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided to the Department of

318 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the enhancement of marketing of

319 state parks.

- 320 **SECTION 15.** The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
- 321 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
- 322 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into
- 323 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 324 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.
- 325 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- 326 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 327 Parks for this purpose.
- 328 **SECTION 16.** The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
- 329 is authorized to maintain the following job classes as non-state
- 330 service: DWFP-Enforcement Trainee (Cadet), Special Operations
- 331 Agent I, Special Operations Agent II and Special Operations Agent
- 332 III.
- 333 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that a
- 334 DWFP-Conservation Officer I position be established and filled to
- 335 be assigned to manage the Mason Creek Game Management Area.
- 336 **SECTION 18.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 337 this act, Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) may be used
- 338 to reallocate or reclassify the following classes of positions:
- 339 DWFP-Conservation Officer I, DWFP-Conservation Officer II,
- 340 DWFP-Conservation Officer III and DWFP-Conservation Officer IV.
- 341 **SECTION 19.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 342 of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended for
- 343 increased charges for State and School Employees' Health Insurance
- 344 Plan premium rates assessed by the Department of Finance and
- 345 Administration in excess of the Fiscal Year 2003 premium rates for
- 346 the health insurance plan.
- 347 **SECTION 20.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 348 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 349 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 350 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 351 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 352 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

353 **SECTION 21.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2003.
