BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be 35 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 36 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday 37 of November 2003, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution 38 39 and by general law. 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed 41 42 constitutional amendment requires the Legislature to enact general law and permits the Legislature to enact local and private law 43 prescribing the manner and procedure by which counties and cities 44 may merge and consolidate to form a metropolitan government." 45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Attorney General of the 46 47 State of Mississippi shall submit this resolution, immediately upon adoption by the Legislature, to the Attorney General of the 48 United States or to the United States District Court for the 49 District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the 50 51 Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
