## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 38

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING DR. JOHN WILLIAM GUYTON, III, UPON  
2 BEING NAMED MISSISSIPPI PROJECT LEARNING TREE'S 2003 EDUCATOR OF  
3 THE YEAR.

4 WHEREAS, Dr. John William Guyton, III, a native of  
5 Starkville, Mississippi, was named Mississippi Project Learning  
6 Tree's 2003 Educator of the Year; and

7 WHEREAS, Project Learning Tree is a world-wide environmental  
8 education network sponsored internationally by the American Forest  
9 Foundation and the Mississippi PLT is sponsored by the Mississippi  
10 Forestry Commission, Mississippi Forestry Association and the  
11 U.S.D.A. Forest Service National Forest in Mississippi; and

12 WHEREAS, the Educator of the Year Award is awarded by the PLT  
13 advisory board from nominations solicited from Mississippi's  
14 PLT/Environmental Education Community; and

15 WHEREAS, as the honoree of this state award, Dr. Guyton  
16 competed on an international level and was one of five  
17 international winners selected; and

18 WHEREAS, Dr. Guyton attended the Golden Triangle Vocational  
19 Technical Center and received certificates in Electricity I and  
20 II, Welding and Refrigeration I and II from vocational school; and

21 WHEREAS, Dr. Guyton furthered his education at Mississippi  
22 State University, where he received his bachelor's degree in 1976,  
23 his master's of education in 1979, and his education doctorate in  
24 1987; and

25 WHEREAS, currently, Dr. Guyton serves as the State 4-H  
26 Specialist in Environmental Education, Associate Level at the



27 Mississippi State University, Extension Service Coastal Research  
28 and Extension Center in Biloxi; and

29 WHEREAS, Dr. Guyton's responsibilities include: establishing  
30 and implementing a comprehensive state-wide Environmental  
31 Education Program; establishing and maintaining liaison with  
32 governmental agencies, environmental organizations and educational  
33 institutions; devise, coordinate and implement workshops,  
34 conferences, camps and meetings; and prepare educational  
35 information, background materials, exhibits and displays; and

36 WHEREAS, throughout his long and distinguished career, Dr.  
37 Guyton has also worked in various other positions such as teacher,  
38 item writer and proof reader, graduate assistant and associate  
39 professor of education, chairman of science department and  
40 assistant professor of physics, air conditioner/heater repair and  
41 residential electrician, regional manager for a jewelry store; and

42 WHEREAS, an active member of his profession and community,  
43 Dr. Guyton is a member of many organizations such as the National  
44 Association of Extension 4-H Agents; Mississippi Environmental  
45 Education Alliance; North American Association for Environmental  
46 Education; Rainwater Astronomical Association; Association of  
47 Teacher Educators; National Science Teachers Association; American  
48 Educational Research Association; and many others; and

49 WHEREAS, in addition, Dr. Guyton serves on a long list of  
50 boards associated with museums, research institutions and  
51 environmental and recreation centers in Mississippi; and

52 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to  
53 recognize and commend outstanding Mississippians such as Dr.  
54 Guyton, who has dedicated his career to improving the quality of  
55 education and the environment:

56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
57 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do commend  
58 and congratulate Dr. John William Guyton, III, upon being named  
59 Mississippi Project Learning Tree's 2003 Educator of the Year and
