SENATE BILL NO. 2855

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-203, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO REVISE THE COMPOSITION OF THE BEAVER CONTROL ADVISORY BOARD; TO
- 3 PROVIDE THAT THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION
- 4 OF SUPERVISORS SHALL BE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT OF ALL ACTUAL 5 AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE DISCHARGE OF HIS DUTIES,
- 6 INCLUDING MILEAGE AS AUTHORIZED BY LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-7-203, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 49-7-203. (1) There is hereby created the Beaver Control
- 11 Advisory Board which shall be composed of the administrative heads
- 12 of the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks,
- 13 State Forestry Commission, Department of Agriculture and Commerce,
- 14 Mississippi Department of Transportation and Mississippi State
- 15 Cooperative Extension Services, the Executive Director of the
- 16 Mississippi Association of Supervisors, the Executive Vice
- 17 President of the Delta Council and the President of the
- 18 Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation.
- 19 (2) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of
- 20 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall be the chairman of the board
- 21 and shall preside over meetings.
- 22 (3) The members of the board shall serve without
- 23 compensation but all members of the board * * * shall be entitled
- 24 to reimbursement for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in
- 25 the discharge of their duties, including mileage as authorized by
- 26 law.
- 27 (4) The board shall have the following duties and
- 28 responsibilities:

29 (a	.) To	adopt	rules	and	regulations	governing	times	and

- 30 places for meetings and governing the manner of conducting its
- 31 business;
- 32 (b) To develop a beaver control program to be
- 33 administered by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries
- 34 and Parks or by a federal agency pursuant to an agreement with the
- 35 commission for such purpose;
- 36 (c) To designate the areas of the state having the
- 37 greatest need for beaver control or eradication and establish a
- 38 list of priority areas on an annual basis;
- 39 (d) To recommend to the Mississippi Commission on
- 40 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks such fees as may be necessary to
- 41 charge participating landowners; and
- 42 (e) To function in an advisory capacity to the
- 43 Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks regarding
- 44 the implementation of the beaver control program.
- 45 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 46 and after July 1, 2003.
