22 Mississippi Association of Educators, Chairman of Hancock County
23 Library Board of Trustees, Gulf Coast Alcorn Alumni Association
24 (past president), Hancock County NAACP, Bay St. Louis Planning and
25 Zoning Commission, St. Rose Altar Society and St. Rose Parish
