Recommit Strike-All AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. Section 97-32-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 97-32-13. (1) Any person under the age of eighteen (18) 8 years who falsely states he is eighteen (18) years of age or older, or presents any document that indicates he is eighteen (18) 10 years of age or older, for the purpose of purchasing or possessing 11 any tobacco or tobacco product, may be subject to the following 12 penalties, in addition to any other punishment authorized by law: 13 14 (a) For the first offense, the person may be required 15 to perform forty (40) hours of community service; (b) For the second offense, the person may have his 16 driver's license or permit suspended for a period of thirty (30) 17 18 days; or 19 (c) For the third or subsequent offense, the person may have his driver's license or permit suspended for a period of 20 thirty (30) days and be fined not less than Twenty-five Dollars 21 22 (\$25.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00). Upon adjudication of any person under the age of 23 eighteen (18) years for a violation of this section, where the 24 person is penalized under subsection (1)(b) or (c) of this 2.5

- 26 section, the judge shall notify the Commissioner of Public Safety
- of the adjudication on a form to be devised by the commissioner
- 28 and the commissioner or his authorized agent shall suspend the
- 29 person's driver's license or permit to drive.

- 3 VIOLATE THE UNLAWFUL PURCHASE PROVISIONS OF THE YOUTH ACCESS TO
- 4 TOBACCO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
