## HOUSE BILL NO. 16

- AN ACT TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE 301 LAMAR STREET BUILDING
- IN JACKSON, MISSISSIPPI, TO THE ROBERT G. CLARK, JR., BUILDING; TO AMEND SECTIONS 29-5-2, 29-5-81, 29-5-161 AND 29-17-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED 2.
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- 5 PURPOSES.
- WHEREAS, Robert G. Clark, Jr., former Speaker Pro Tempore of 6
- 7 the Mississippi House of Representatives, completed nine
- consecutive terms as a member of the Mississippi House of 8
- 9 Representatives from District 47, which includes Attala, Holmes
- 10 and Yazoo Counties; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Clark, a native of Holmes County, Mississippi, 11
- began his journey of contribution to Mississippi by becoming a 12
- 13 teacher, coach and principal in our state's school system, where
- 14 he helped hundreds of youth; and
- WHEREAS, in 1968, Mr. Clark began serving in the Mississippi 15
- 16 House of Representatives, where he became known as a fair and
- 17 honest leader; and
- WHEREAS, during his tenure in the Legislature, Mr. Clark rose 18
- 19 from freshman lawmaker to House Education Committee Chairman,
- 20 where he led the House to pass many monumental educational acts,
- most notably the 1982 Education Reform Act, the 1984 Vocational 21
- 22 Education Reform Act and the recent Education Enhancement Act; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Clark's legislative career culminated in 1992, 23
- 24 when he was elected by his colleagues to the Office of Speaker Pro
- Tempore, the leadership post second only to the Speaker of the 25
- House in which he effectively served and was a role model to many; 26

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         WHEREAS, as the Speaker Pro Tempore, Mr. Clark served as the
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    Chairman of the House Management Committee, which oversees the
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    vital internal business and personnel affairs of the House; and
         WHEREAS, because of his long and distinguished career of
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    public service to the people of Mississippi, and due to his
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    outstanding work in the community, which is greatly valued by
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    many, including the Mississippi National Association for the
    Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), we wish to express our
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    appreciation to and respect for Robert G. Clark, Jr., by renaming
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    the 301 Lamar Street Building in his honor; NOW, THEREFORE,
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         BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
         SECTION 1. The 301 Lamar Street Building in Jackson,
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    Mississippi, shall be renamed the Robert G. Clark, Jr., Building.
                     Section 29-5-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
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         SECTION 2.
    amended as follows:
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         29-5-2.
                  The duties of the Department of Finance and
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    Administration shall be as follows:
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                   (i) To exercise general supervision and care over
    and keep in good condition the following state property located in
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    the City of Jackson: the New State Capitol Building, the Woolfolk
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    State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin Justice Building, the
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    Walter Sillers Office Building, the War Veterans' Memorial
    Building, the Charlotte Capers Building, the William F. Winter
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    Archives and History Building, the Ike Sanford Veterans Affairs
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    Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the Governor's Mansion,
    the Heber Ladner Building, the Burroughs Building, the Robert E.
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    Lee Office Building, the Robert E. Lee Parking Garage, the Manship
    House Restoration and Visitor Center, the State Records Center,
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    the Robert G. Clark, Jr., Building, and all other properties
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    acquired in the same transaction at the time of the purchase of
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    the Robert E. Lee Hotel property from the First Federal Savings
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    and Loan Association of Jackson, Mississippi, which properties are
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    more particularly described in a warranty deed heretofore executed
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- 61 and delivered on April 22, 1969, and filed for record in the
- 62 office of the Chancery Clerk of the First Judicial District of
- 63 Hinds County, Mississippi, located in Jackson, Mississippi, on
- 64 April 25, 1969, at 9:00 a.m., and recorded in Deed Book No. 1822,
- 65 page 136 et seq., and the Central High Building and 101 Capitol
- 66 Centre.
- 67 (ii) To exercise general supervision and care over
- 68 and keep in good condition the Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building
- 69 located in Biloxi, Mississippi.
- 70 (iii) To exercise general supervision and care
- 71 over and keep in good condition the State Service Center, located
- 72 at the intersection of State Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum
- 73 Industrial Drive in Hattiesburg, Mississippi.
- 74 (b) To assign suitable office space for the various
- 75 state departments, officers and employees who are provided with an
- 76 office in any of the buildings under the jurisdiction or control
- 77 of the Department of Finance and Administration. However, the
- 78 assignment of space in the New Capitol Building shall be
- 79 designated by duly passed resolution of the combined Senate Rules
- 80 Committee and the House Management Committee, meeting as a joint
- 81 committee, approved by the Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the
- 82 House of Representatives. A majority vote of the members of the
- 83 Senate Rules Committee and a majority vote of the members of the
- 84 House Management Committee shall be required on all actions taken,
- 85 resolutions or reports adopted, and all other matters considered
- 86 by the full combined committee on occasions when the Senate Rules
- 87 Committee and the House Management Committee shall meet as a full
- 88 combined committee.
- 89 (c) To approve or disapprove with the concurrence of
- 90 the Public Procurement Review Board, any lease or rental
- 91 agreements by any state agency or department, including any state
- 92 agency financed entirely by federal and special funds, for space
- 93 outside the buildings under the jurisdiction of the Department of

- 94 Finance and Administration. In no event shall any employee,
- 95 officer, department, federally funded agency or bureau of the
- 96 state be authorized to enter a lease or rental agreement without
- 97 prior approval of the Department of Finance and Administration and
- 98 the Public Procurement Review Board.
- The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- 100 use architects, engineers, building inspectors and other personnel
- 101 for the purpose of making inspections as may be deemed necessary
- 102 in carrying out its duties and maintaining the facilities.
- 103 (d) To acquire by lease, lease-purchase agreement, or
- 104 otherwise, as provided in Section 27-104-107, and to assign
- 105 through the Office of General Services, by lease or sublease
- 106 agreement from the office, and with the concurrence of the Public
- 107 Procurement Review Board, to any state agency or department,
- 108 including any state agency financed entirely by federal and
- 109 special funds, appropriate office space in the buildings acquired.
- SECTION 3. Section 29-5-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 111 amended as follows:
- 112 29-5-81. Grounds of public buildings over which the
- 113 Department of Finance and Administration has jurisdiction shall
- 114 comprise the following:
- 115 (a) In the City of Jackson, Mississippi:
- New State Capitol: Bounded on the north by High Street, on
- 117 the west by North West Street, on the south by Mississippi Street,
- 118 and on the east by North President Street;
- Governor's Mansion: Bounded on the north by Amite Street, on
- 120 the west by North West Street, on the south by Capitol Street and
- 121 on the east by North Congress Street;
- 122 Woolfolk State Office Building: Bounded on the north by High
- 123 Street, on the west by Lamar Street, on the south by Hamilton
- 124 Street and on the east by North West Street;
- 125 Old State Capitol and War Veterans' Memorial Building
- 126 Complex: Bounded on the north by Amite Street, on the west by

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- 127 North State Street and South State Street, on the south by Pearl
- 128 Street and on the east by property of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio
- 129 Railroad Company;
- 130 Carroll Gartin Justice Building and Walter Sillers Office
- 131 Building Complex: Bounded on the north by George Street, on the
- 132 west by North West Street, on the south by High Street and on the
- 133 east by North President Street;
- Heber Ladner Building: Bounded on the north by Mississippi
- 135 Street, on the west by North Congress Street, on the south by the
- 136 property of Galloway Methodist Church used as a parking lot and on
- 137 the east by the property on which the Mississippi Farm Bureau
- 138 Federation Building stands;
- 139 State Board of Health Building: Bounded on the north by
- 140 Stadium Drive, on the west by the property of Mississippi Hospital
- 141 and Medical Service, on the southwest by property on which is
- 142 located a Standard Oil service station, on the southeast by
- 143 property leased by the Mississippi Federation of Women's Clubs and
- 144 on the east by North State Street;
- Robert E. Lee Building and other properties acquired in the
- 146 same transaction: Particularly described in warranty deed
- 147 executed and delivered on April 22, 1969, and filed for record in
- 148 the Office of the Chancery Clerk of the First Judicial District of
- 149 Hinds County, Mississippi, located in Jackson, Mississippi, on
- 150 April 25, 1969, at 9:00 a.m., and recorded in deed book No. 1822,
- 151 page 136, et seq.;
- 152 Charlotte Capers Building: Bounded on the north by the Old
- 153 Capitol Building, on the west by South State Street, on the south
- 154 by Pearl Street, and on the east by the Illinois Central Railroad
- 155 tracks;
- William F. Winter Archives and History Building: Bounded on
- 157 the north by Mississippi Street; on the west by North Street, on
- 158 the south by Amite Street, and on the east by Jefferson Street.

- 159 Mayfair Building: Bounded on the north by George Street, on
- 160 the west by Northwest Street, on the south by Walter Sillers
- 161 Office Building complex, and on the east by North President
- 162 Street;
- 163 Court of Appeals Building: Bounded on the west by North
- 164 State Street, on the north by George Street, on the east by North
- 165 Street, and on the south by the building designated as 654 North
- 166 State Street, including the parking area east of and adjacent to
- 167 the 654 North State Street Building;
- 168 Central High Building;
- 169 101 Capitol Centre: Located at 101 West Capitol Street,
- 170 Jackson, Mississippi;
- 171 Robert G. Clark, Jr., Building: Located at 301 North Lamar
- 172 Street, Jackson, Mississippi.
- 173 (b) The Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building: Located in the
- 174 City of Biloxi, Mississippi.
- 175 (c) The State Service Center: Located at the intersection
- 176 of State Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum Industrial Drive in the
- 177 City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi.
- 178 **SECTION 4.** Section 29-5-161, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 179 amended as follows:
- 180 29-5-161. (1) As used in this section:
- 181 (a) "Smoke" or "smoking" means inhaling, exhaling,
- 182 burning, carrying or otherwise possessing any lighted cigarette,
- 183 cigar, pipe or any other object or device of any form that
- 184 contains lighted tobacco or any other smoking product.
- 185 (b) "State office building" means the New State Capitol
- 186 Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin
- 187 Justice Building, the Walter Sillers Office Building, the Heber
- 188 Ladner Building, the Department of Transportation Building, the
- 189 Robert E. Lee Office Building, the Robert G. Clark, Jr., Building,
- 190 the State Board of Health Building, the Public Employees'
- 191 Retirement System Building, the Central High Building, the Court

- 192 of Appeals Building, the War Veterans' Memorial Building, the
- 193 State Archives Building, the Ike Sanford Veterans Affairs
- 194 Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the Burroughs Building,
- 195 the Mayfair Building, 101 Capitol Centre and any other facility in
- 196 the state that is owned or leased by the State of Mississippi or
- 197 any agency, department or institution of the state and that is
- 198 used for housing state employees during the time of performance of
- 199 their regular duties for the state. If only part of a facility is
- 200 leased by the state or an agency, department or institution of the
- 201 state, only the leased part of the facility will be considered to
- 202 be a state office building for the purposes of this definition.
- 203 (c) "Designated smoking area" means any area or areas
- 204 specifically designated, by the person, agency or entity having
- 205 jurisdiction or supervision over a state office building, for the
- 206 act of smoking, and shall be limited to one or more of the
- 207 following areas:
- 208 (i) Enclosed private offices;
- 209 (ii) Designated employee break areas; and
- 210 (iii) Designated outdoor areas on the property.
- 211 (2) No person shall smoke in any state office building
- 212 except as provided in this section.
- 213 (3) The person, agency or entity having jurisdiction or
- 214 supervision over a state office building shall:
- 215 (a) Designate the areas in the building that will be
- 216 designated smoking areas;
- 217 (b) Conspicuously display signs that designate both
- 218 smoking and nonsmoking areas, except that signs are not required
- 219 in private offices; and
- 220 (c) Make every reasonable effort to prevent designated
- 221 smoking areas from impinging upon nonsmoking areas by the use of
- 222 existing physical barriers and ventilation systems. However, the
- 223 Mississippi Department of Archives and History shall not be

- 224 required to designate smoking areas in any building under its
- 225 jurisdiction.
- 226 (4) The person, agency or entity having jurisdiction or
- 227 supervision over a state office building shall not allow smoking
- 228 in the state office building, except in designated smoking areas,
- 229 and shall use reasonable efforts to prevent smoking in the state
- 230 office building, except in designated smoking areas, including,
- 231 but not limited to, the following:
- 232 (a) Posting appropriate signs informing state
- 233 employees, invitees, guests and other persons that smoking is
- 234 prohibited in the state office building, except in designated
- 235 smoking areas.
- 236 (b) Securing the removal of persons who smoke in the
- 237 state office building, except in designated smoking areas.
- 238 (5) This section expressly preempts to the state the
- 239 regulation of smoking in state office buildings and supersedes any
- 240 municipal or county ordinance on the subject.
- 241 SECTION 5. Section 29-17-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 242 amended as follows:
- 243 29-17-1. As used in this chapter, the following words shall
- 244 have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly
- 245 requires otherwise:
- 246 (a) "Public facility" shall mean any building or other
- 247 facility owned by the State of Mississippi, or by any agency,
- 248 department or political subdivision of the State of Mississippi,
- 249 which is occupied, used or under the control of the State of
- 250 Mississippi, or any agency or department of the State of
- 251 Mississippi, or any junior college district of the State of
- 252 Mississippi, or the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 253 Higher Learning of the State of Mississippi, or any institution
- 254 under the jurisdiction of the Board of Trustees of State
- 255 Institutions of Higher Learning of the State of Mississippi.

256	(b) "Capitol complex" shall include the following state
257	property located in Jackson, Mississippi: the New State Capitol
258	Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin
259	Justice Building, the Walter Sillers Office Building, the War
260	Veterans' Memorial Building, the Charlotte Capers Building, the
261	William F. Winter Archives and History Building, the Ike Sanford
262	Veterans Affairs Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the
263	Governor's Mansion, the Heber Ladner Building, the Burroughs
264	Building, the Robert E. Lee Hotel Property, the Central High
265	Legislative Services Building, the Robert G. Clark, Jr., Building
266	or any other properties which may come under the supervision of
267	the Department of Finance and Administration and are deemed to be
268	in the Capitol Complex.
269	SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from

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and after its passage.
