HOUSE BILL NO. 209

- AN ACT TO PERMIT SENIOR CITIZENS WITH INCOMES BELOW 1 \$15,000.00 PER YEAR TO REGISTER AND ATTEND A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF 2. 3 HIGHER LEARNING TUITION-FREE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, the term "senior 5
- citizen" means a person who is age sixty-five (65) or older. 6
- 7 (2) A senior citizen shall be permitted, under regulations
- 8 as may be prescribed by the Mississippi Board of Trustees of State
- Institutions of Higher Learning: 9
- (a) To register for and enroll in courses as a 10
- full-time or part-time student for academic credit in any state 11
- 12 institution of higher learning in this state;
- 13 (b) To register for and audit courses offered for
- academic credit in any state institution of higher learning in 14
- 15 this state; and
- 16 (c) To register for and enroll in courses not offered
- for academic credit in any state institution of higher learning in 17
- 18 this state.
- In order to be eligible under this section, a senior 19
- 20 citizen must have had a taxable individual income not exceeding
- 21 Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) for Mississippi income tax
- purposes for the year preceding the year in which enrollment is 22
- 23 sought.
- Senior citizens registering under the provisions of this 24 (4)
- section shall pay no tuition or fees except fees established for 25
- 26 the purpose of paying for course materials, such as laboratory
- 27 fees, but shall be subject to the admission requirements of the

- 28 institution and a determination by the institution of its ability
- 29 to offer the course or courses for which the senior citizen
- 30 registers. The Mississippi Board of Trustees of State
- 31 Institutions of Higher Learning shall establish procedures to
- 32 ensure that tuition-paying students are accommodated in courses
- 33 before senior citizens registering under the provisions of this
- 34 section are enrolled. However, the state institutions of higher
- 35 learning may make individual exceptions to these procedures when
- 36 the senior citizen has completed seventy-five percent (75%) of the
- 37 requirements for a degree.
- 38 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 39 and after July 1, 2004.
