1 2 3 4 5 6 7	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT A LICENSED NURSE WHO HAS MET THE REQUIREMENTS AND ACQUIRED A CERTIFICATE FROM THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR CERTIFICATION OF SCHOOL NURSES, INC., AND WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD OR THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AS SCHOOL NURSE AND NOT AS AN ADMINISTRATOR SHALL RECEIVE AN ANNUAL SALARY SUPPLEMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
10	amended as follows:
11	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
12	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
13	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi
14	Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county
15	and separate school district shall be determined and paid in
16	accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in
17	this subsection. For teachers holding the following types of
18	licenses or the equivalent as determined by the State Board of
19	Education, and the following number of years of teaching
20	experience, the scale shall be as follows:

It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made

67 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the

68 funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall

69 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal

70 and compensation system implemented by the State Board of

71 Education. The State Board of Education shall have the authority

to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to

73 establish, administer and maintain the system.

74 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a

75 minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no

76 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any

77 school year during which the local supplement paid to any

78 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that

79 paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties

80 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school

81 year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health

82 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the

83 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a

84 part of the amount of individual local supplement.

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base 88 pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of

89 Seven Hundred Forty Dollars (\$740.00) for each year of teaching

90 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such

91 person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

92 For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base

93 pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of

94 Six Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$675.00) for each year of

95 teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license

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For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Ten Dollars (\$610.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$465.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience.

and School Years Thereafter Annual Increments

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Forty Dollars (\$640.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$480.00) for each year of teaching

experience possessed by the person holding such license until such 128 129 person shall have twenty-four (24) years of teaching experience. The level of professional training of each teacher to be used 130 131 in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each 132 year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license 133 issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current 134 school year. The following employees shall receive an annual 135 (2) (a) salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars 136 (\$6,000.00), plus fringe benefits, in addition to any other 137 138 compensation to which the employee may be entitled: (i) Any licensed teacher who has met the 139 140 requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is 141 employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education 142 143 as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall 144 submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the 145 certificate was received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the 146 147 teacher shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be eligible for a 148 149 prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the 150 school year. 151 (ii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the 152 requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors 153 154 and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 155 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. 156 licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State 157 Department of Education that the endorsement was received before October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement 158 159 in the current school year, or the licensed school counselor shall

submit such documentation to the State Department of Education

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before February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 161 162 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 163 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 164 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 165 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 166 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school counselors, 167 and any school counselor receiving the salary supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under 168 169 item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such 170 salary supplement. 171 (iii) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and 172 audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a 173 Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local 174 school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and 175 audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of 176 177 Education that the certificate or endorsement was received before 178 October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed speech-language 179 180 pathologist and audiologist shall submit such documentation to the State Department of Education before February 15 in order to be 181 182 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the 183 second term of the school year. However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be discontinued two (2) years 184 185 after the date on which the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification process for a Master 186 187 Teacher certificate for school speech-language pathologists and 188 audiologists, and any school speech-language pathologist and audiologist receiving the salary supplement will be required to 189 190 complete the Master Teacher certificate process under item (i) of 191 this paragraph in order to continue receiving such salary 192 supplement.

L94	requirements and acquired a certificate from the National Board
L95	for Certification of School Nurses, Inc., and who is employed by a

L97	nurse and not as an administrator. The licensed school nurse
L98	shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education
L99	that the certificate was received before October 15 in order to be

205	(b) An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for

209	for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and
210	audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in
211	the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school
212	district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of
213	completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement
214	for any employee of the school district described under paragraph
215	(a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the
216	school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the
217	process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement.
218	If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing
219	the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an
220	employee, the local school district may agree to directly
221	reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the
222	employee.
223	(c) All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process
224	reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid
225	directly by the State Department of Education to the local school
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district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program
allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations
promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to
appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall
not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving
such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local
supplement to which employees with similar training and experience

(d) The State Department of Education may not pay any process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who does not complete the certification or endorsement process required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.
