## HOUSE BILL NO. 1478

1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56.5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO GRANT FREE PARKING PRIVILEGES TO PERSONS WHO HAVE BEEN ISSUED A DISTINCTIVE LICENSE PLATE IDENTIFYING THEM AS A PEARL HARBOR SURVIVOR OR PURPLE HEART RECIPIENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	27-19-56.5. In recognition of the patriotic service rendered
9	by Mississippians who survived the attack on Pearl Harbor and by
LO	Mississippians who are recipients of the Purple Heart Medal, any
L1	such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor
L2	vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as a Pearl Harbor
L3	survivor or not more than two (2) distinctive motor vehicle
L4	license plates or tags identifying him as a Purple Heart Medal
L5	recipient. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color and
L6	design designated by the State Tax Commission.
L7	The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the State
L8	Tax Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of
L9	the counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license
20	plates or tags. A tag fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), in
21	addition to all other taxes and fees, shall be collected by the
22	tax collector for the Pearl Harbor distinctive tag. The first
23	distinctive tag issued to Purple Heart Medal recipients under the
24	provisions of this section shall be exempt from ad valorem taxes,
25	privilege taxes and all other taxes and fees. There shall be no
26	exemption from ad valorem taxes, privilege taxes or other taxes
27	and fees for the issuance of a second distinctive tag to Purple
28	Heart Medal recipients. However, the surviving spouse of a

04/HR03/R1124 PAGE 1 (JWB\LH) 29 deceased person who was issued a Purple Heart Medal distinctive 30 license plate or tag under this section shall be entitled to apply 31 for or retain one (1) such license tag and may continue annually to renew registration for such distinctive motor vehicle license 32 33 plate or tag for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. At the 34 time of application or renewal registration, a surviving spouse 35 who desires to retain such distinctive plate or tag shall file 36 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is unmarried, and any such vehicle when so registered shall be exempt 37 from ad valorem taxes, privilege taxes and all other taxes and 38 39 The tax collector shall monthly forward the additional fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) charged for issuance of a Pearl Harbor 40 distinctive tag to the State Tax Commission which shall deposit 41 such fee to the credit of the State General Fund. An applicant 42 for a distinctive tag under this section shall present to the 43 issuing official either (a) written proof that the applicant is an 44 45 honorably discharged former member of one (1) of the Armed Forces of the United States and, while serving in the Armed Forces of the 46 United States, was present during the attack on the island of 47 Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, between the hours 48 49 of 7:55 a.m. and 9:45 a.m., Hawaii time, or (b) written proof that 50 the applicant is a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon a 51 52 personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to include 53 station wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) 54 registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the person 55 making application therefor, and when issued to such person shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard 56 57 license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle. The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable 58 59 between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a 60 vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or

61	otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by
62	such owner and returned to the tax collector.
63	The person to whom a distinctive license plate has been
64	issued pursuant to this section may park free of charge in any
65	state, county or municipal metered parking space or public parking
66	facility when the person is operating or occupying the vehicle to
67	which the license plate is assigned.
68	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

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and after July 1, 2004.
