A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND 1 ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF CALLESTYNE PERRY HALL-CRAWFORD AND EXPRESSING 2 3 DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HER FAMILY AND FRIENDS UPON HER PASSING. 4 WHEREAS, Callestyne Perry Hall-Crawford, born July 2, 1961, 5 to Mary Hall and Benjamin Perry in Greenwood, Mississippi, departed this earthly life on Friday, January 30, 2004, causing 6 great sorrow and loss to her family and friends; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Mrs. Hall-Crawford, who confessed an early faith in Christ, attended the Greenwood Public Schools, graduating with 9 honors in 1979 from Greenwood High School; and 10 WHEREAS, she furthered her education at Alcorn State 11 12 University, where she received her bachelor of science degree in 13 political science in 1983, and at the University of Mississippi Law School, where she obtained her juris doctorate degree in 1986; 14 15 and WHEREAS, embarking upon her professional career in law, Mrs. 16 Hall-Crawford gained employment with the North Mississippi Rural 17 18 Legal Services in 1986, where she served as managing attorney until the office closed in 1996; and 19 20 WHEREAS, after the closing of the North Mississippi Rural Legal Services, Mrs. Hall-Crawford opened her own practice and 21 later became public defender for Holmes County; and 22 WHEREAS, she became Greenwood's first black assistant city 23 attorney, serving from 1996-1997 and assumed her duties as the 24 city's public defender, which she held from 1997 until her 25 26 untimely passing; and

27 WHEREAS, described as a true friend and dedicated attorney 28 who was an inspiration to all, Mrs. Hall-Crawford was united in 29 holy matrimony to Larry Crawford on July 2, 1992, and to their 30 union two children were born; and

31 WHEREAS, ever committed to her religious faith and service of 32 others, Mrs. Hall-Crawford was a lifelong member of the Friendship 33 Missionary Baptist Church where she dedicated her life to God; and

WHEREAS, her other professional, social and civic affiliations consisted of memberships in the following organizations: the Mississippi Bar Association, the Leflore County Bar Association, the Magnolia Bar Association, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Order of the Eastern Star, Phi Alpha Delta Legal Fraternity, Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society and the Mississippi Public Defender Association; and

WHEREAS, though her passing has caused great sorrow and 41 grief, the legacy of her memory will forever be cherished in the 42 hearts and memories of her survivors, including: her husband, 43 Larry Crawford; children, Steven Jay Crawford and Symone Joi 44 45 Crawford; a sister, Rhondalind Barcus, a stepsister, Stefenie Lott 46 and a cousin, Deborah Jackson; two brothers, George Lucas, Jr., 47 and James Lucas; stepfather, George Lucas, Sr.; godmother, Hermanell Mickey; four aunts; one uncle; and a host of other 48 relatives and friends; and 49
