## SENATE BILL NO. 2124

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627 AND 23-15-713, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW QUALIFIED ELECTORS TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR ANY REASON; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-653, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE ALL REGISTRARS' OFFICES TO REMAIN OPEN FROM 7 A.M. TO 7 P.M. ON THE THREE SATURDAYS PRIOR TO EACH ELECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

10 23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to 11 receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be 12 furnished to a person only upon the oral or written request of the 13 elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent, 14 child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a 15 power of attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the 16 17 elector may orally request an absentee ballot application on behalf of the elector. An absentee ballot application must have 18 the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be 19 20 initialed by the registrar or his deputy in order to be utilized to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee 21 ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction 22 provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in 23 24 which the election is being held and which contains the seal and initials required by this section. Such application shall be 25 substantially in the following form: 26

resident of Mississippi or have moved therefrom within thirty (30)
days of the coming presidential election.

36 () I am an enlisted or commissioned member, male or female,
37 of any component of the United States Armed Forces and am a
38 citizen of Mississippi, or spouse or dependent of such member.
39 () I am a member of the Merchant Marine or the American Red
40 Cross and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of
41 such member.

42 () I am a disabled war veteran who is a patient in any
43 hospital and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of
44 such veteran.

45 () I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the
46 United States with any branch of the Armed Forces or with the
47 Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen of
48 Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such civilian.

49 () I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing
50 outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
51 District of Columbia.

() I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college, 52 university, junior or community college, high, junior high, 53 54 elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting 55 56 residence or spouse or dependent of such student, teacher or administrator who maintains a common domicile outside the county 57 of my voting residence with such student, teacher or 58 59 administrator.

60 () I desire to vote by absentee ballot at this election.
61 () I have a temporary or permanent physical disability.
62 () I am sixty-five (65) years of age or older.

temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized

I realize that I can be fined up to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and sentenced up to five (5) years in the Penitentiary for making a false statement in this application and for selling my vote and violating the Mississippi Absentee Voter Law. (This sentence is to be in bold print.)

If you are temporarily or permanently disabled, you are not required to have this application notarized or signed by an official authorized to administer oaths for absentee balloting. You are required to sign this application in the proper place and have a person eighteen (18) years of age or older witness your signature and sign this application in the proper place.

114	SECTION 2. Section 23-15-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
115	amended as follows:
116	23-15-713. For the purpose of this subarticle, any duly
117	qualified elector may vote as provided in this subarticle if he be
118	one who falls within the following categories:
119	(a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,
120	teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior
121	college, high, junior high, or elementary grade school whose
122	studies or employment at such institution necessitates his absence
123	from the county of his voting residence on the date of any
124	primary, general or special election, or the spouse and dependents
125	of said student, teacher or administrator if such spouse or
126	dependent(s) maintain a common domicile, outside of the county of
127	his voting residence, with such student, teacher or administrator.

from his place of residence on any election day due to his
employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi
congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of such
person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter
away from the county of the spouse's voting residence.

134 (c) Any qualified elector who desires to vote by
135 absentee ballot for any reason.

(d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent physical disability and who, because of such disability, is unable to vote in person without substantial hardship to himself or others, or whose attendance at the voting place could reasonably cause danger to himself or others.

(e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized outside of his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles distant from his residence, if the parent, spouse or dependent will be with such person on election day.

146 (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or 147 older.

(g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional delegation absent from Mississippi on election day, and the spouse and dependents of such member of the congressional delegation.

152 SECTION 3. Section 23-15-653, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 153 amended as follows:

23-15-653. All registrars' offices shall remain open <u>from</u>
<u>7:00 a.m.</u> until <u>7:00 p.m.</u> on the <u>three (3)</u> Saturdays prior to each
election.

157 SECTION 4. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 158 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 159 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 160 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States S. 164 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 165 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 166 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

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
