SENATE BILL NO. 2130

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DISPLAY OF THE TEN COMMANDMENTS ON 1 SCHOOL PROPERTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 WHEREAS, the Ten Commandments are a declaration of 4 fundamental principles that are the cornerstone of a fair and just 5 society; and WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence declares that 6 7 governments are instituted to secure certain unalienable rights, 8 including life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, with which 9 all human beings are endowed by their Creator to which they are entitled by the laws of nature and of nature's God; and 10 WHEREAS, the organic laws of the United States Code and the 11 constitutions of every state, using various expressions, recognize 12 God as the source for the blessings of liberty; and 13 WHEREAS, the First Amendment to the Constitution of the 14 15 United States and Section 18 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 secure rights against laws respecting an establishment of 16 religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; and 17 WHEREAS, disputes and doubts have arisen with respect to 18 public displays of the Ten Commandments; NOW, THEREFORE, 19 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The Ten Commandments may be displayed on or 21 22 within property owned or administered by any school district 23 within the State of Mississippi. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 24 25 and after its passage.
