## SENATE BILL NO. 2267

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11-7-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 2 PROVIDE THAT NO PARENT WHO HAS ABANDONED A CHILD SHALL BE AWARDED 3 DAMAGES FOR WRONGFUL DEATH OF THAT CHILD; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 11-7-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 11-7-13. Whenever the death of any person shall be caused by 9 any real, wrongful or negligent act or omission, or by such unsafe 10 machinery, way or appliances as would, if death had not ensued, have entitled the party injured or damaged thereby to maintain an 11 action and recover damages in respect thereof, or whenever the 12 death of any person shall be caused by the breach of any warranty, 13 express or implied, of the purity or fitness of any foods, drugs, 14 medicines, beverages, tobacco or any and all other articles or 15 16 commodities intended for human consumption, as would, had the 17 death not ensued, have entitled the person injured or made ill or damaged thereby, to maintain an action and recover damages in 18 19 respect thereof, and such deceased person shall have left a widow or children or both, or husband or father or mother, or sister, or 20 21 brother, the person or corporation, or both that would have been liable if death had not ensued, and the representatives of such 22 23 person shall be liable for damages, notwithstanding the death, and the fact that death was instantaneous shall in no case affect the 24 right of recovery. The action for such damages may be brought in 25 26 the name of the personal representative of the deceased person for the benefit of all persons entitled under the law to recover, or 2.7 by widow for the death of her husband, or by the husband for the 28
