SENATE BILL NO. 2269

AN ACT TO CREATE SECTION 73-39-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO CERTIFY ANIMAL CONTROL AGENCIES TO UTILIZE CERTAIN CONTROLLED 3 4 SUBSTANCES FOR THE HUMANE DESTRUCTION OF ANIMALS AND TO CERTIFY AND PRESCRIBE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFIED ANIMAL EUTHANASIA 5 6 TECHNICIANS (CAET) TO PERFORM EUTHANASIA OF ANIMALS; TO AMEND 7 SECTION 73-39-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE 8 MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO ADOPT RULES IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as
- 12 Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 13 73-39-43. (1) For purposes of this section, the following
- 14 terms shall have the meaning ascribed herein, unless the context
- 15 shall indicate otherwise:
- 16 (a) "Certified animal control agency" means a federal,
- 17 county or municipal animal shelter, dog pound, or animal control
- 18 agency, private humane society, state, county or municipal law
- 19 enforcement agency, or any combination thereof, which temporarily
- 20 houses stray, unwanted or injured animals and which is certified
- 21 pursuant to this section.
- 22 (b) "Certified animal euthanasia technician (CAET)"
- 23 means a person employed by a certified animal control agency who
- 24 is authorized by the Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine to
- 25 perform euthanasia on animals with approved scheduled substances.
- 26 (2) (a) The board shall adopt rules providing for the
- 27 issuance of permits for the purchase, possession and use of sodium
- 28 pentobarbital or other board-approved drugs for euthanasia by
- 29 certified animal control agencies. The rules shall set forth
- 30 guidelines for the proper storage and handling of the substances

- 31 and other provisions as may be necessary to ensure that these
- 32 drugs are used solely for the purpose set forth in this section.
- 33 The rules shall also provide for an application or inspection fee
- 34 and a renewal fee at set intervals.
- 35 (b) Upon certification by the board that the applicant
- 36 meets the qualifications set forth in the rules, a permit shall be
- 37 issued.
- 38 (c) The board may revoke or suspend the permit upon the
- 39 determination that the permittee fails to follow the rules of the
- 40 board regarding proper storage and handling or use of the approved
- 41 euthanasia substances.
- 42 (3) (a) Euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control
- 43 agency may only be performed by a licensed veterinarian, including
- 44 a licensed veterinary technician employed by and functioning under
- 45 the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian, or a certified
- 46 animal euthanasia technician as provided by law. A certified
- 47 animal control agency which employs a certified animal euthanasia
- 48 technician may purchase, possess and administer sodium
- 49 pentobarbital or such other drug which the board may approve for
- 50 the euthanasia of animals. Sodium pentobarbital and such other
- 51 drugs approved by the board shall be the only drugs used for the
- 52 euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control agency. Upon
- 53 submission of a complete application, payment of a fee established
- 54 by the board and successful completion of a board-approved animal
- 55 euthanasia specialist training course by the applicant, the Board
- of Veterinary Examiners shall issue to any person whom it
- 57 determines to be qualified a certificate for the person to
- 58 function as a certified animal euthanasia specialist.
- 59 (b) No officer or agent of a certified animal control
- 60 agency or veterinarian acting in good faith and with due care
- 61 pursuant to this act may be held liable either criminally or
- 62 civilly for that act, nor shall any civil or criminal liability
- 63 attach to the employer of the officer, agent or veterinarian.

- (c) A court order shall not be necessary to carry out
- 65 this section.
- 66 (4) Any person who violates this section is guilty of a
- 67 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine not
- 68 exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or imprisonment in the
- 69 county jail, for a term not exceeding six (6) months, or both.
- 70 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-39-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 71 amended as follows:
- 72 73-39-9. The board shall elect from its members a president,
- 73 vice president and secretary-treasurer. The board is authorized:
- 74 (a) To adopt reasonable rules governing the practice of
- 75 veterinary medicine as are necessary to enable it to carry out and
- 76 make effective the purpose and intent of this chapter. Such rules
- 77 shall be adopted and promulgated in accordance with the provisions
- 78 of this chapter.
- 79 (b) To adopt rules of professional conduct appropriate
- 80 to establish and maintain a high standard of integrity, skills and
- 81 practice in the profession of veterinary medicine. In prescribing
- 82 such rules of professional conduct, the board may be guided by the
- 83 principles of veterinary medical ethics adopted by the American
- 84 Veterinary Medical Association and the Mississippi Veterinary
- 85 Medical Association.
- 86 (c) To have its rules printed which shall be
- 87 distributed to all licensed veterinarians.
- 88 (d) To bring proceedings in courts for the enforcement
- 89 of this chapter or any rules made pursuant thereto.
- 90 (e) To hold at least one (1) regular meeting on the
- 91 third Tuesday in June each year in the City of Jackson at such
- 92 time and location as fixed by the board, for the purpose of
- 93 conducting examinations of applicants for license to practice
- 94 veterinary medicine, the election of officers and to consider any
- 95 other business that may properly come before the board. Other

- 96 meetings may be held upon the call of the president and secretary
- 97 of the board.
- 98 (f) To pass upon the qualifications of applicants for a
- 99 license to practice veterinary medicine in this state, or for a
- 100 certificate as an animal technician.
- 101 (g) To prescribe the subjects, character, manner, time
- 102 and place of holding examinations and the filing of applications
- 103 for examinations and to conduct the examinations.
- 104 (h) To issue temporary permits to practice to duly
- 105 qualified applicants which shall be signed by the secretary.
- 106 (i) To provide for, regulate and require all persons
- 107 licensed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter to
- 108 renew their license annually; to require as a condition precedent
- 109 to such annual renewal the payment of the annual renewal fee as
- 110 provided herein; to issue annual renewal licenses to such persons
- 111 and to suspend or revoke the license of such persons who fail,
- 112 refuse or neglect to renew same or pay such fees.
- 113 (j) To conduct investigations and hearings upon
- 114 complaints calling for discipline of a licensee or applicant for
- 115 license.
- 116 (k) To take testimony on any matter under its
- 117 jurisdiction and any member thereof may administer oaths.
- 118 (1) To issue summons and subpoenas, including subpoenas
- 119 duces tecum, for any witness in connection with any matter within
- 120 the jurisdiction of the board, which shall be signed by either the
- 121 president or the secretary-treasurer of the board.
- 122 (m) To adopt such forms as it may deem necessary.
- 123 (n) To adopt rules and regulate the certification of
- 124 animal control agencies and animal euthanasia technicians pursuant
- 125 to Section 73-39-43.
- 126 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 127 and after July 1, 2004.
