5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37-16-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	37-16-13. (1) The school board of a local school district
9	may award an honorary high school diploma in a form prescribed and
10	supplied to school districts by the State Board of Education to
11	veterans of World War II, the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam
12	Conflict who were unable to complete their education due to their
13	military service. The honorary diploma is available to any
14	honorably discharged veteran residing in Mississippi who was (a)
15	scheduled to graduate between 1941 and 1955 but was inducted into
16	military service before completing the necessary graduation
17	requirements, or (b) was scheduled to graduate between 1963 and
18	1970 but volunteered for military service and received the Vietnam
19	Service Ribbon. Family members of deceased eligible veterans may
20	apply for the diploma to be awarded posthumously.
21	(2) The State Board of Education and State Veterans Affairs
22	Board jointly shall develop a uniform application for persons

- 23 seeking a diploma under subsection (1) of this section. The 24 application shall request no less than the following information:
- 25 (a) The veteran's name, social security number and date
