1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-59-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, T
2	AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DEVELOP A STATEWIDE
3	HEART ATTACK AND STROKE CARE SYSTEM AND EXPEND FUNDS THEREFOR; AN
4	FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 41-59-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- amended as follows: 7
- 41-59-5. (1) The State Board of Health shall establish and 8
- 9 maintain a program for the improvement and regulation of emergency
- 10 medical services (hereinafter EMS) in the State of Mississippi.
- The responsibility for implementation and conduct of this program 11
- 12 shall be vested in the State Health Officer of the State Board of
- Health along with such other officers and boards as may be 13
- specified by law or regulation. 14
- (2) The board shall provide for the regulation and licensing 15
- of public and private ambulance service, inspection and issuance 16
- 17 of permits for ambulance vehicles, training and certification of
- EMS personnel, including drivers and attendants, the development 18
- 19 and maintenance of a statewide EMS records program, development
- and adoption of EMS regulations, the coordination of an EMS 20
- 21 communications system, and other related EMS activities.
- The board is authorized to promulgate and enforce such 22
- 23 rules, regulations and minimum standards as needed to carry out
- 24 the provisions of this chapter.
- (4) The board is authorized to receive any funds 25

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- 26 appropriated to the board from the Emergency Medical Services
- Operating Fund created in Section 41-59-61 and is further 2.7
- authorized, with the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council 28

acting in an advisory capacity, to administer the disbursement of 29 30 such funds to the counties, municipalities and organized emergency 31 medical service districts and the utilization of such funds by the same, as provided in Section 41-59-61. 32 33 The department acting as the lead agency, in 34 consultation with and having solicited advice from the EMS 35 Advisory Council, shall develop a uniform nonfragmented inclusive 36 statewide trauma care system that provides excellent patient care. It is the intent of the Legislature that the purpose of this 37 38 system is to reduce death and disability resulting from traumatic 39 injury, and in order to accomplish this goal it is necessary to assign additional responsibilities to the department. The 40 department is assigned the responsibility for creating, 41 42 implementing and managing the statewide trauma care system. The 43 department shall be designated as the lead agency for trauma care systems development. The department shall develop and administer 44 45 trauma regulations that include, but are not limited to, the Mississippi Trauma Care System Plan, trauma system standards, 46 47 trauma center designations, field triage, interfacility trauma 48 transfer, EMS aero medical transportation, trauma data collection, 49 trauma care system evaluation and management of state trauma 50 systems funding. The department shall take the necessary steps to develop, adopt and implement the Mississippi Trauma Care System 51 52 Plan and all associated trauma care system regulations necessary 53 to implement the Mississippi trauma care system. The department 54 shall cause the implementation of both professional and lay trauma 55 education programs. These trauma educational programs shall 56 include both clinical trauma education and injury prevention. As 57 it is recognized that rehabilitation services are essential for traumatized individuals to be returned to active, productive 58

lives, the department shall coordinate the development of the

inclusive trauma system with the Mississippi Department of

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- 61 Rehabilitation Services and all other appropriate rehabilitation 62 systems.
- 63 (6) The State Board of Health is authorized to receive any
- 64 funds appropriated to the board from the Mississippi Trauma Care
- 65 System Fund created in Section 41-59-75. It is further
- 66 authorized, with the Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council
- 67 and the Mississippi Trauma Advisory Committee acting in advisory
- 68 capacities, to administer the disbursements of such funds
- 69 according to adopted trauma care system regulations.
- 70 (7) The department acting as the lead agency, in
- 71 consultation with having solicited advice from the Emergency
- 72 Medical Services Advisory Council, shall develop a uniform
- 73 nonfragmented inclusive statewide Heart Attack and Stroke Care
- 74 System that provides excellent patient care. It is the intent of
- 75 the Legislature that the purpose of this system is to reduce death
- 76 and disability resulting from acute heart attack and stroke, and
- 77 in order to accomplish this goal it is necessary to assign
- 78 additional responsibilities to the department. The department is
- 79 assigned the responsibility for creating, implementing and
- 80 managing the statewide Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care System.
- 81 The department shall be designated as the lead agency for Heart
- 82 Attack and Stroke Acute Care Systems development. The department
- 83 shall develop and administer Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care
- 84 regulations that include, but are not limited to, the Mississippi
- 85 Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care System Plan, Heart Attack and
- 86 Stroke Acute Care system standards, Heart Attack and Stroke Acute
- 87 Care center designations, field triage, interfacility heart attack
- 88 and stroke transfer, Emergency Medical Services aero medical
- 89 transportation, heart attack and stroke data collection, Heart
- 90 Attack and Stroke Acute Care System evaluation and management of
- 91 any Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care Systems funding. The
- 92 department shall take the necessary steps to develop, adopt and
- 93 <u>implement the Mississippi Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care</u>

94	System Plan and all associated Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care
95	System regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Heart
96	Attack and Stroke Acute Care System. The department shall cause
97	the implementation of both professional and lay heart attack and
98	stroke education programs. These heart attack and stroke
99	educational programs shall include both clinical heart attack and
100	stroke education and risk factor prevention. As it is recognized
101	that rehabilitation services are essential for heart attack and
102	stroke survivors to be returned to active, productive lives, the
103	department shall coordinate the development of the inclusive heart
104	attack and stroke system with the Mississippi Department of
105	Rehabilitation Services and all other appropriate rehabilitation
106	services.
107	(8) The State Board of Health is authorized to receive any
108	funds appropriated to the board from state, federal and private
109	funds. It is further authorized, with the Emergency Medical
110	Services Advisory Council and the Mississippi Task Force on Heart
111	Disease and Stroke Prevention acting in advisory capacities, to
112	administer the disbursements of such funds according to adopted
113	Heart Attack and Stroke Acute Care System regulations.
114	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
115	and after July 1, 2004.
