SENATE BILL NO. 2995

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND
2 ADMINISTRATION TO INITIATE A FACILITY AUDIT OF STATE-OWNED
3 FACILITIES; TO REQUIRE THE BUREAU OF BUILDING, GROUNDS AND REAL
4 PROPERTY MANAGEMENT TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO THE AUDIT DATA TO THE
5 LEGISLATURE AND OTHER STATE AGENCIES THAT ARE AFFECTED; TO DIRECT
6 THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO ONLY USE
7 DISCRETIONARY FUNDS TO INITIATE THE FACILITY AUDIT; AND FOR
8 RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

10 **SECTION 1.** The Department of Finance and Administration,
11 acting through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
12 Management, is hereby authorized and directed to initiate a
13 facility audit for state-owned structures managed by the
14 Department of Finance and Administration and report on or before
15 January 1, 2005, to the Joint Facilities Management Advisory
16 Committee. The report shall also include a plan to audit all
17 state-owned facilities, in addition to the structures managed by
18 the Department of Finance and Administration, on or before January
19 1, 2008. The facility audit shall be performed by a professional
20 architectural/engineering entity and maintained through
21 completion.

22 (2) The facility audit shall encompass all existing
23 state-owned facilities and further incorporate all new constructed
24 state-owned facilities managed by the Department of Finance and
25 Administration. The facility audit reporting shall be
26 administered at the discretion of the Bureau of Building, Grounds
27 and Real Property Management for the purpose of generating
28 reports, determining the value of state-owned facilities and their
29 size, scale, composition, condition and location, and qualifying
30 and prioritizing capital improvement, repair and renovation

31 requests. The Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property
32 Management shall provide access to the facility audit data to the
33 Legislature and other state agencies that are affected and from
34 which the data is compiled. The Department of Finance and
35 Administration through the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real
36 Property Management, is directed to only use discretionary funds
37 to initiate the facility audit.

38 (3) It is the intent of the Legislature to authorize the
39 facility audit to establish the consolidation of data into a
40 centralized location, to heighten efficiency in processing capital
41 improvement and repair and renovation projects, and to possess the
42 ability to produce data queries on any given entry.

43 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
44 and after its passage.
