| 9 | on April 1, 1910, in Forest, Mississippi, to Ruben Julius |
| 10 | Knoblock, originally from Lafayette, Indiana, and Mary Belle |
| 11 | (Tillman) Knoblock, originally from Magnolia, Mississippi. She |
| 12 | first studied Art in her junior year of high school, 1926-1927, |
| 13 | and later graduated from Belhaven College in Jackson, Mississippi, |
| 14 | in 1932 with majors in Art and Spanish. However, the desperate |
| 15 | times of the Great Depression afforded no opportunities for any |
| 16 | career, especially in Art or Spanish. After college, McCravey |
| 17 | worked with the W.P.A., establishing libraries in Scott County, |

| 19 | WHEREAS, by 1937, Jackson Public Schools began to offer Art |
| 20 | classes and McCravey took a job teaching Art at Enochs Junior High |
| 21 | School. She later transferred to Central High School in Jackson, |

| 23 | High School, where she taught until 1968. During these years, she |
| 24 | served with dedication to instruct and inspire many of the state's |
