SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE AND CAREER OF 2 PROFESSIONAL FISHERMAN WAYNE MONK OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI, AND 3 EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

WHEREAS, Mr. Wayne Monk of Biloxi, Mississippi, an avid
professional fisherman who won many fishing tournaments and rodeos
on the Mississippi Gulf Coast, passed away on March 15, 2004; and
WHEREAS, Wayne Monk attended D'Iberville High School, and
after high school, he entered the United States Marine Corps with
his nephew, Mike Vereker; and

10 WHEREAS, Wayne has had a lifelong love of fishing and won 11 many fishing rodeos. He was a member of the Gulf Coast Bass 12 Masters and was a charter member of the Pride of the South Bass 13 Masters and then the South Mississippi Association of Bass Clubs; 14 and

15 WHEREAS, Wayne always dreamed of being a professional 16 fisherman. He began to work toward his dream in the late 1970s by 17 fishing in the American Anglers Association in both the 18 Mississippi and Louisiana Divisions. He fished in the Red Man Tournament Trail and the Mid-South Bass Association (now known as 19 20 the FLW sponsored by Wal-Mart). Wayne won the Mid-South Bass 21 Association Classic at Kremer Marine in October 1991. Winning 22 this Classic tournament garnered him sponsors and started his 23 professional career; and

24 WHEREAS, later he joined "Mississippi Outdoors" in 1993 and 25 became the Staff Pro and Co-Host for the show. Wayne lived and 26 achieved his dream; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Monk was preceded in death by his parents, 27 28 Ronald E. and Maybelle Monk; a sister, Betty Teague; and two brothers, Robert Emory and Joseph Anthony Monk; and 29 30 WHEREAS, he is survived by his wife, Dena Monk; his sisters, 31 Marie Vereker, Mary Voyuvich, Eva Fountain and Elaine Lazenby; his 32 brothers, William, Howard, Jimmy, Roy and Ronnie Monk; his godchild, David Lazenby, Jr.; and many special nieces and nephews, 33 34 including his fishing buddy and nephew Michael Vereker; and WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of this 35 well-known member of the Mississippi Gulf Coast fishing community: 36 37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 38 39 we do hereby commend the life and career of professional fisherman Wayne Monk of Biloxi, Mississippi, and express to his surviving 40 family the sympathy of the Legislature on his passing. 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to 42
