## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A REMEDY TO THE ELECTION CONTEST FOR 1 MISSISSIPPI SENATE DISTRICT 29 OF THE MISSISSIPPI STATE SENATE. 2 3 WHEREAS, on or about November 25, 2003, the Hinds County 4 Commissioners of Election certified the election of Dwayne Thomas as Senator for Mississippi Senate District 29; and 5 WHEREAS, on December 5, 2003, Richard White filed with the 6 7 Secretary of the Senate a Petition to Contest the Election for 8 Mississippi State Senate District 29; and 9 WHEREAS, Section 38, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, provides that each house of the Legislature "...shall judge of the 10 qualifications, return and election of its own members"; and 11 WHEREAS, Section 23-15-955 provides that the legislative 12 resolution of election contests involving Senate and House of 13 Representative seats "...shall be conducted in accordance with 14 15 procedures and precedents established by the House of Representatives or the Senate as the case may be. Such procedures 16 and precedents may be found in the Journals of the House of 17 Representatives and of the State Senate and/or in the published 18 Rules of the House of Representatives and of the State Senate"; 19 20 and WHEREAS, on January 6, 2004, the Senate adopted Senate 21 22 Resolution No. 2 which established a special committee and charged 23 it with the duty of investigating and proposing to the Senate a remedy to the election contest for District 29 in the form of a 24 25 resolution; and WHEREAS, on January 7, 2004, pursuant to Senate Resolution 26

27 No. 2, the Lieutenant Governor appointed Senators Burton
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28 (Chairman), Doxey, Hyde-Smith, Posey and Robertson to serve on the 29 Special Committee to Investigate the Election Contest for Senate 30 District 29 of the Mississippi Senate; and

31 WHEREAS, on January 8, 2004, the Special Committee met, 32 organized and scheduled hearings on the election contest for 33 Senate District 29 to begin on January 14, 2004; and

34 WHEREAS, the Special Committee conducted public hearings on 35 the election contest from Wednesday, January 14, 2004, through 36 Friday, January 16, 2004; and

37 WHEREAS, the parties to the election contest were ably 38 represented by counsel who presented facts and legal argument to 39 the Special Committee; and

40 WHEREAS, numerous witnesses were called to testify at the 41 hearing and these witnesses were examined by counsel and the 42 members of the Special Committee;

WHEREAS, the Special Committee to Investigate the Election 43 Contest for Senate District 29 of the Mississippi Senate has 44 concluded its hearing into the election contest and has filed a 45 report with the Secretary of the Senate as required by Senate 46 47 Resolution No. 2, 2004 Regular Session, that contains the relevant 48 facts of the contest, Mississippi law that is involved in the 49 election contest, the findings of the committee and the recommendations of the committee; and 50

51 WHEREAS, the Special Committee to Investigate the Election 52 Contest for Senate District 29 of the Mississippi Senate has 53 concluded in its report that as a result of the numerous errors 54 that the committee found in the conduct of the November 4, 2003, 55 General Election, the committee finds that it is impossible to 56 determine the will of the voters in Senate District 29:

57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 58 MISSISSIPPI, That because it is impossible to determine the will 59 of the electorate in the Senate District 29 General Election, the 60 Senate finds that the Honorable Dwayne Thomas cannot be seated as 5. No. 3 \*SS26/R467CS.1\* 04/SS26/R467CS.1 PAGE 2 a member of the Senate and hereby orders that a Special Election shall be held by the Hinds County Election Commission for the office of State Senator for District 29 on Tuesday, February 10, 2004, between Honorable Dewayne Thomas and Honorable Richard White.

66 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Hinds County Election 67 Commission shall be responsible for conducting the special 68 election in accordance with the terms of this resolution and all 69 applicable state laws not in conflict with the terms of this 70 resolution.
