REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3122: Appropriation; Jr. Colleges - Support.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

19	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the Budget		
20	Contingency Fund, created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code		
21	of 1972, for the aid and support of the public community and		
22	junior colleges, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and		
23	ending June 30, 2005\$ 14,789,832.00		
24	SECTION 4. The funds appropriated in this act for the aid		
25	and support of the public and community junior colleges shall be		
26	apportioned in accordance with the following assigned weights:

In the 2/5 FTE Formula, such Academic, Technical, Vocational, 58 59 Associate Degree Nursing and Associate Degree Allied Health funds shall be disbursed on the basis of prior year full-time 60 61 equivalency (FTE) of hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters for each public community and junior college as 62 of the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its 63 64 equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of 65 Mississippi. However, associate degree nursing students who 66 reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay 67 purposes. 68 Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of 69 70 virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall 71 and spring semesters. Those semester credit hours being hosted 72 and provided by one institution shall receive funding at the 73 weight of 1.0. 74 Of the funds appropriated in the act for the aid and support 75 of the public community and junior colleges, funds up to Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000.00) are provided to be set 76 77 aside as a mechanism to hold harmless those colleges that lose funding in the second year of a five year phase-in implementation 78 79 period to a full-time equivalency (FTE) funding formula. 80 The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior 81 Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and 82 junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for 83 Community and Junior Colleges. 84 If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at 85 86 the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate 87 in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and 88

determine that any such public or community junior college does

- 90 not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary
- 91 expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2004,
- 92 until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that
- 93 event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is
- 94 expressly authorized to make an advance to any such public
- 95 community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient
- 96 operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated
- 97 hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any such advance to
- 98 any one public community or junior college shall not exceed
- 99 thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state appropriated
- 100 funds received by such public community or junior college during
- 101 the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount
- 102 of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of
- 103 the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or
- 104 junior college when enrollment has been ascertained and
- 105 distribution of funds is made.
- 106 **SECTION 5.** No part of the amount herein appropriated shall
- 107 be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for
- 108 administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the
- 109 extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the
- 110 expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.
- 111 **SECTION 6.** The funds disbursed under the provisions of this
- 112 act shall be accounted for through the State Board for Community
- 113 and Junior Colleges.
- 114 **SECTION 7.** The following public community and junior
- 115 colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided by
- 116 Sections 1, 2 and 3 of this act:
- 117 Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College,
- 118 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community
- 119 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community
- 120 College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College,

- 126 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that none
- 127 of the General Funds appropriated herein shall be expended for the
- 128 purpose of paying salaries, wages, and fringe benefits of any
- 129 public community and junior college employee who is serving as a
- 130 member of the State of Mississippi Legislature.
- 131 **SECTION 9.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 132 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 133 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
- 134 Community and Junior Colleges for the purposes of hiring nursing
- 135 and allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and
- 136 allied health student loans and providing instructional support
- 137 for the Rural Health Corps for the fiscal year beginning
- 138 July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005.....\$ 1,200,000.00.
- The funds appropriated in this section shall be allocated as
- 140 follows:
- 141 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)
- 142 public community and junior colleges.
- 143 (2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of
- 144 full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and
- 145 junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the
- 146 last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent
- 147 of the preceding year counting only those students who reside
- 148 within the State of Mississippi.
- 149 The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and
- 150 make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget
- 151 Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments
- 152 of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual

153	community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by
154	the Legislative Budget Office.
155	SECTION 10. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
156	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
157	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the aid of the public
158	community and junior colleges, to fund life and health insurance,
159	for all employees of the public community and junior colleges for
160	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005.
161	\$ 16,808,282.00.
162	The funds allocated in this section shall only be used to
163	participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health
164	Insurance Plan. Any funds appropriated in this section which are
165	not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for
166	the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.
167	SECTION 11. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
168	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
169	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
170	establishing and operating One-Stop Career Centers at each of the
171	public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning
172	July 1, 2004, and ending June 30, 2005\$ 4,500,000.00.
173	SECTION 12. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
174	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
175	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
176	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
177	cost of Sign Language Interpreter Training at the public community
178	and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004,
179	and ending June 30, 2005 \$ 179,050.00.
180	SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
181	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
182	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
183	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
184	cost of the Education Technology Program at the public community

185	and junior colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004,
186	and ending June 30, 2005\$ 3,599,160.00.
187	SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
188	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
189	Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
190	State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of
191	defraying the cost of servicing the debt on bonds issued for the
192	Education Technology Program at the community and junior colleges
193	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending
194	June 30, 2005\$ 3,160,215.00.
195	The funds appropriated in this section shall be derived from
196	Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections
197	27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
198	SECTION 15. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition
199	(MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi
200	resident for the purposes of participating in this appropriation
201	regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of
202	enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section
203	37-155-5(d)(iii).
204	SECTION 16. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
205	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
206	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
207	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
208	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
209	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
210	performance measures provided below:

254	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
255	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
256	cost of the Mississippi Delta Community College Industrial
257	Training Program, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and
258	ending June 30, 2005\$ 150,000.00.
259	SECTION 19. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
260	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
261	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
262	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
263	cost of the Holmes Community College Industrial Technology
264	Complex, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2004, and ending
265	June 30, 2005\$ 150,000.00.
266	SECTION 20. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
267	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
268	general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
269	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
270	cost of the Jones County Junior College Industrial Technology
271	Complex, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005
272	\$ 150,000.00
273	SECTION 21. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
274	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
275	general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for
276	Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the
277	cost of the Pearl River Community College Industrial Technology
278	Complex, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005
279	\$ 150,000.00

280	SECTION 22. Of the funds provided in this act, it is the
281	intention of the Legislature that Seventy-five Thousand Dollars
282	(\$75,000.00) shall be allocated to Northeast Community College to
283	defray the costs of operation of the Crow's Neck Environmental
284	Center in Tishomingo County.
285	SECTION 23. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
286	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
287	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
288	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
289	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
290	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
291	SECTION 24. This act shall take effect and be in force from
292	and after July 1, 2004.
