## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 10

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO EXPAND THE CALL OF THE FIRST EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF 2004 TO INCLUDE LEGISLATION THAT WILL REINSTATE MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY FOR THE POVERTY LEVEL AGED OR DISABLED (PLAD) GROUP.

- 5 WHEREAS, the Medicaid program provides a comprehensive system
- 6 of health care services to approximately 720,000 Mississippians,
- 7 which services are vital to the health and well-being of most of
- 8 those individuals; and
- 9 WHEREAS, because of the significant budgetary pressures
- 10 before and during the 2004 legislative session, the Executive
- 11 Branch proposed, as a cost-saving measure, to remove the 65,000
- 12 individuals in the Poverty Level Aged or Disabled (PLAD) group
- 13 from Medicaid eligibility and move them to the federal Medicare
- 14 program; and
- WHEREAS, during the waning days of the 2004 session, in order
- 16 to prevent the repeal of the Division of Medicaid, the House of
- 17 Representatives reluctantly agreed to remove the PLADs from
- 18 Medicaid eligibility on July 1, 2004, after providing for federal
- 19 waivers to cover the 5,000 PLADs not eligible for Medicare and
- 20 certain other chronically ill PLADs; and
- 21 WHEREAS, although most of the PLADs will be covered under
- 22 Medicare, their loss of Medicaid eligibility will significantly
- 23 impact the availability and quality of the health care that they
- 24 will receive, particularly the number of vitally needed
- 25 prescription drugs, and most of them will face increased costs for
- 26 many of their health care services; and

27	WHEREAS, there will be major costs to the health care system
28	in Mississippi after the PLADs are no longer on Medicaid, because
29	many hospitals and other providers will be forced to bear the
30	health care costs not covered by Medicare for a large number of
31	those individuals; and
32	WHEREAS, although federal law will require the state to
33	remove the PLADs from Medicaid eligibility by January 2006, or pay
34	the total cost for the PLADs with state funds, we believe that
35	this group of low income elderly and disabled individuals should
36	be kept on the Medicaid rolls at the present time, because of the
37	great hardships that will be imposed on them by the transition to
38	Medicare:
39	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
40	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we request the
41	Governor to expand the call of the First Extraordinary Session of
42	2004 to include legislation that will reinstate Medicaid
43	eligibility for the Poverty Level Aged or Disabled (PLAD) group.
