- AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 77-3-701 THROUGH 77-3-735,
- MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDE THE MISSISSIPPI TELEPHONE 2.
- SOLICITATION ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 77-3-737, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE DATE OF REPEAL ON THOSE REENACTED SECTIONS 3
- 4
- FROM JULY 1, 2005, TO JULY 1, 2007; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 77-3-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- reenacted as follows: 8
- 9 77-3-701. This article shall be known and may be cited as
- the "Mississippi Telephone Solicitation Act." 10
- SECTION 2. Section 77-3-703, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 11
- reenacted as follows: 12
- 77-3-703. The use of the telephone to make all types of 13
- 14 solicitations to consumers is pervasive. This article gives
- consumers a tool by which to object to telemarketing calls as 15
- 16 these communications can amount to a nuisance, an invasion of
- privacy, and can create a health and safety risk for certain 17
- consumers who maintain their phone service primarily for emergency 18
- 19 medical situations.
- SECTION 3. Section 77-3-705, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 20
- 21 reenacted as follows:
- 22 77-3-705. For the purposes of this article, the following
- 23 words and terms shall have the meanings ascribed in this section
- 24 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- (a) "Consumer" means a person to whom is assigned in 25
- the State of Mississippi a residential telephone line and 26
- 27 corresponding telephone number, who uses the residential line
- primarily for residential purposes. 28

- 29 (b) "Caller identification service" means a type of
- 30 telephone service which permits a telephone subscriber to view the
- 31 telephone number and name of the person or entity making an
- 32 incoming telephone call.
- 33 (C) "Telephone solicitor" means any person, firm,
- 34 entity, organization, partnership, association, corporation,
- 35 charitable entity, or a subsidiary or affiliate thereof, who
- engages in any type of telephone solicitation on his or her own 36
- behalf or through representatives, independent contractors, 37
- 38 salespersons, agents, automated dialing systems or machines or
- 39 other individuals or systems.
- "Telephone solicitation" means any voice 40
- 41 communication over the telephone line of a consumer for the
- 42 purpose of:
- 43 (i) Encouraging the purchase or rental of, or
- investment in, property; or 44
- 45 (ii) Soliciting a sale of any consumer goods or
- 46 services, or an extension of credit for consumer goods or
- 47 services.
- 48 (e) "Commission" means the Mississippi Public Service
- 49 Commission.
- 50 (f) "Doing business in this state" refers to businesses
- which conduct telephone solicitations from any location to 51
- 52 consumers located in this state.
- 53 "Consumer goods or services" means any real
- property or any tangible or intangible personal property which is 54
- 55 normally used for personal, family or household purposes,
- 56 including, without limitation, any property intended to be
- 57 attached to, or installed in, any real property, and any services
- related to the property. 58

- 59 (h) "Established business relationship" means a prior
- or existing relationship formed by a voluntary two-way 60

61 communication between a person or entity and a consumer, with or

- 62 without an exchange of consideration, on the basis of an inquiry,
- 63 application, purchase or transaction by the consumer, which
- 64 relationship is currently existing or was terminated within six
- 65 (6) months of the telephone solicitation; however, the act of
- 66 purchasing consumer goods or services under an extension of credit
- 67 does not create an existing business relationship between the
- 68 consumer and the entity extending credit to the consumer for such
- 69 purchase. The term does not include the situation wherein the
- 70 consumer has merely been subject to a telephone solicitation by or
- 71 at the behest of the telephone solicitor within the six (6) months
- 72 immediately preceding the contemplated telephone solicitation.
- 73 (i) "Charitable organization" means any person or
- 74 entity holding itself out to be established for any benevolent,
- 75 educational, philanthropic, humane, scientific, patriotic, social
- 76 welfare or advocacy, public health, environmental or conservation,
- 77 civic or other eleemosynary purpose or for the benefit of law
- 78 enforcement personnel, fire fighters, or any other persons who
- 79 protect the public safety, or for any other purpose where a
- 80 charitable appeal is the basis of the solicitation.
- 81 **SECTION 4.** Section 77-3-707, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 82 reenacted as follows:
- 83 77-3-707. (1) Except as otherwise provided pursuant to
- 84 Section 77-3-709 or 77-3-711, a telephone solicitor may not make
- 85 or cause to be made any telephone solicitation to any consumer in
- 86 this state unless the telephone solicitor has purchased the
- 87 "no-calls" database from the commission or the entity under
- 88 contract with the commission.
- 89 (2) Except as otherwise provided pursuant to Section
- 90 77-3-709 or 77-3-711, a telephone solicitor may not make or cause
- 91 to be made any telephone solicitation to any consumer in this
- 92 state who has given notice to the commission, or the entity under
- 93 contract with the commission, of his or her objection to receiving
- 94 telephone solicitations.

95 (3) The commission, or an entity under contract with the 96 commission, shall establish and operate a "no-calls" database 97 composed of a list of telephone numbers of consumers who have 98 given notice of their objection to receiving telephone 99 solicitations. The "no-calls" database may be operated by the 100 commission or by another entity under contract with the

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commission.

- 102 (4) Each local exchange company and each competing local 103 exchange carrier shall provide written notification on a 104 semiannual basis to each of its consumers of the opportunity to 105 provide notification to the commission or the entity under contract with the commission, that the consumer objects to 106 107 receiving telephone solicitations. The notification must be 108 disseminated at the option of the carrier, by television, radio or newspaper advertisements, written correspondence, bill inserts or 109 messages, a publication in the consumer information pages of the 110 111 local telephone directory, or any other method not expressly 112 prohibited by the commission.
- 113 **SECTION 5.** Section 77-3-709, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 114 reenacted as follows:
- 115 77-3-709. The commission, in its discretion, may allow
 116 telephone solicitors to make telephone solicitations without
 117 requiring them to purchase the "no-calls" database, and regardless
 118 of whether a telephone solicitation may be made to a consumer who
 119 has given notice of his objection to receiving such solicitations,
 120 provided that it adopts a written policy incorporating the
 121 following criteria:
- (a) The telephone solicitor must demonstrate to the commission that its proposed telephone solicitation is reasonably related to an established business relationship as defined in Section 77-3-705(h), or is being made in response to an invitation or notice from a consumer which clearly signifies that he is open to a contact being initiated;

128	(b) The telephone solicitation is to be made by a
129	person or entity for the purpose of soliciting a contribution or
130	donation to a bona fide nonprofit corporation, regardless of
131	whether consumer goods or services will be provided to the
132	consumer in return for the contribution or donation; or
133	(c) The consumer will not be telephoned for a telephone
134	solicitation as defined in Section 77-3-705(d), but he will be
135	telephoned for a bona fide religious or charitable purpose,
136	including an invitation to attend an event or a request for a
137	contribution or donation.
138	In all cases, the telephone solicitor must demonstrate that
139	it will not use an automated dialing system or a method that will
140	block or otherwise circumvent the consumer's use of a caller
141	identification service.
142	In making its determination of whether to allow a telephone
143	solicitation to be made under the policy which will include the
144	limitations set forth in this section, the commission shall
145	exercise due care in investigating previous conduct of the
146	telephone solicitor seeking such authority. The commission may
147	deny any telephone solicitor the privilege of making telephone
148	solicitations under this section, notwithstanding that any of the
149	criteria set forth in this section have been met.
150	SECTION 6. Section 77-3-711, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
151	reenacted as follows:
152	77-3-711. The provisions of this article shall not apply to:
153	(a) A person soliciting:
154	(i) Who does not make the major sales presentation
155	during the telephone solicitation;
156	(ii) Without the intent to complete or obtain
157	provisional acceptance of a sale during the telephone
158	solicitation; or
159	(iii) Without the intent to complete, and who does

not complete, the sales presentation during the telephone

- 161 solicitation, but who completes the sales presentation at a later
- 162 face-to-face meeting between the person soliciting and the
- 163 prospective purchaser or consumer.
- (b) A person who is a licensee under Chapter 35, Title
- 165 73, Mississippi Code of 1972, who is a resident of the State of
- 166 Mississippi, and whose telephone solicitation is for the sole
- 167 purpose of selling, exchanging, purchasing, renting, listing for
- 168 sale or rent or leasing real estate in connection with his real
- 169 estate license and not in conjunction with any other offer.
- 170 (c) A motor vehicle dealer as that term is defined in
- 171 Section 63-17-55, who is a resident of the State of Mississippi
- 172 and who maintains a current motor vehicle dealer's license issued
- 173 by the Mississippi Motor Vehicle Commission, whose telephone
- 174 solicitation is for the sole purpose of selling, offering to sell,
- 175 soliciting or advertising the sale of motor vehicles in connection
- 176 with his motor vehicle dealer's license and not in conjunction
- 177 with any other offer.
- 178 (d) An agent as that term is defined in Section 83-17-1
- 179 whose telephone solicitation is for the sole purpose of
- 180 soliciting, consulting, advising, or adjusting in the business of
- 181 insurance.
- 182 (e) A broker-dealer, agent, or investment advisor
- 183 registered under Chapter 71, Title 75, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 184 whose telephone solicitation is for the sole purpose of effecting
- 185 or attempting to effect the purchase or sale of securities or has
- 186 the purpose of providing or seeking to provide investment or
- 187 financial advice.
- 188 (f) A person calling on behalf of a charitable
- 189 organization which is registered under Chapter 11, Title 79,
- 190 Mississippi Code of 1972, whose telephone solicitation is for the
- 191 sole purpose of soliciting for the charitable organization and who
- 192 receives no compensation for his activities on behalf of the
- 193 organization.

- (g) A person calling on behalf of a newspaper of
 general circulation, whose telephone solicitation is for the sole
 purpose of soliciting a subscription to the newspaper from, or
- 197 soliciting the purchase of advertising by, the consumer.
- 198 (h) A person calling on behalf of any supervised
- 199 financial institution or parent, subsidiary or affiliate thereof.
- 200 As used in this section, "supervised financial institution" means
- 201 any commercial bank, trust company, savings and loan association,
- 202 mutual savings bank, credit union, industrial loan company, small
- 203 loan company, consumer finance lender, commercial finance lender
- 204 or insurer, provided that the institution has a physical office
- 205 located in the State of Mississippi and is subject to supervision
- 206 by an official or agency of the State of Mississippi or of the
- 207 United States.
- 208 (i) A person calling on behalf of a funeral
- 209 establishment licensed under Section 73-11-41, if the sole purpose
- 210 of the telephone solicitation relates to services provided by the
- 211 funeral establishment in the course of its ordinary business.
- 212 (j) Any telephone solicitor who solicits a consumer
- 213 with whom he has an established business relationship.
- 214 **SECTION 7.** Section 77-3-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 215 reenacted as follows:
- 216 77-3-713. All telephone solicitors must register with the
- 217 commission before conducting any telephone solicitations in the
- 218 State of Mississippi.
- 219 **SECTION 8.** Section 77-3-715, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 220 reenacted as follows:
- 221 77-3-715. The commission may promulgate rules and
- 222 regulations necessary to effectuate this article, including, but
- 223 not limited to, the following:
- 224 (a) The methods by which consumers may give notice to
- 225 the commission or its contractor of their objection to receive
- 226 solicitations or revocation of the notice;

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- 228 effective and the effect of a change of telephone number on the
- 229 notice;
- (c) The methods by which objections and revocations are
- 231 collected and added to the database;
- 232 (d) The methods by which a person or entity desiring to
- 233 make telephone solicitations may obtain access to the database as
- 234 required to avoid calling the telephone number of consumers
- 235 included in the database;
- (e) The process by which the database is updated, and
- 237 the frequency of updates;
- 238 (f) The process by which telephone solicitors must
- 239 register with the commission for the purpose of conducting
- 240 telephonic solicitations in the state;
- 241 (g) The establishment of fees to be charged by the
- 242 commission or its contractor to telephone solicitors for access to
- 243 or for paper or electronic copies of the database on an annual
- 244 basis;
- 245 (h) The establishment of a written policy which clearly
- 246 articulates the circumstances under which the commission, in its
- 247 discretion, may allow exceptions to the provisions of this article
- 248 pursuant to Section 77-3-703; and
- 249 (i) All other matters relating to the database that the
- 250 commission deems necessary.
- SECTION 9. Section 77-3-717, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 252 reenacted as follows:
- 253 77-3-717. If the Federal Trade Commission establishes a
- 254 single national database of telephone numbers of consumers who
- 255 object to receiving telephone solicitations, the commission must
- 256 include the portion of the single national database that relates
- 257 to the State of Mississippi in the database established under this
- 258 article.

- 259 **SECTION 10.** Section 77-3-719, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 260 reenacted as follows:
- 261 77-3-719. Information contained in the database established
- 262 under this article may be used and accessed only for the purpose
- 263 of compliance with this article and shall not be otherwise subject
- 264 to public inspection or disclosure.
- 265 **SECTION 11.** Section 77-3-721, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 266 reenacted as follows:
- 267 77-3-721. All fees collected under the provisions of this
- 268 article shall be deposited into a special fund which is created in
- 269 the State Treasury to be expended by the commission for the
- 270 implementation and administration of this article. At the end of
- 271 each fiscal year, earned interest and unexpended monies remaining
- 272 in the fund may not revert to any other fund of the state, but
- 273 shall remain available for appropriations to administer this
- 274 article. The Legislature shall appropriate annually from the fund
- 275 the amount necessary for the administration of this article to the
- 276 commission.
- 277 **SECTION 12.** Section 77-3-723, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 278 reenacted as follows:
- 279 77-3-723. (1) Any person or entity who makes an authorized
- 280 telephone solicitation to a consumer in this state shall announce
- 281 clearly, at the beginning of each call, his or her name, the
- 282 company he or she represents and the purpose of the call. Such
- 283 calls may only be made between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00
- 284 p.m. Central Standard Time. No telephone solicitations may be
- 285 made on a Sunday. For purposes of this provision, an "authorized
- 286 telephone solicitation" means a solicitation that is made: (a) to
- 287 a consumer who is not listed on the most current "no-calls"
- 288 database; (b) by a telephone solicitor who has been authorized to
- 289 make such solicitations under the provisions of Section 77-3-709;
- 290 or (c) by a telephone solicitor who is exempt from this article
- 291 under the provisions of Section 77-3-711.

- 292 (2) A person or entity who makes a telephone solicitation to 293 a consumer in this state may not utilize knowingly any method that 294 blocks or otherwise circumvents the consumer's use of a caller 295 identification service, nor may the person or entity use an 296 automated dialing system or any like system that uses a recorded 297 voice message to communicate with the consumer unless the person 298 or entity has an established business relationship with the consumer and uses the recorded voice message to inform the 299 300 consumer about a new product or service.
- 301 **SECTION 13.** Section 77-3-725, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 302 reenacted as follows:
- 77-3-725. The commission may investigate alleged violations 303 304 and initiate proceedings relative to a violation of this article 305 or any rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this article. Such proceedings include, without limitation, proceedings to issue 306 a cease and desist order, and to issue an order imposing a civil 307 penalty not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each 308 309 violation. The commission shall afford an opportunity for a fair hearing to the alleged violator(s) after giving written notice of 310 311 the time and place for said hearing. Failure to appear at any 312 such hearing may result in the commission finding the alleged 313 violator(s) liable by default. Any telephone solicitor found to have violated this article, pursuant to a hearing or by default, 314 315 may be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed Five Thousand 316 Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each violation to be assessed and collected by the commission. Each telephonic communication shall 317 318 constitute a separate violation.
- All penalties collected by the commission shall be deposited in the special fund created under Section 77-3-721 for the administration of this article.
- The commission may issue subpoenas, require the production of relevant documents, administer oaths, conduct hearings, and do all

- 324 things necessary in the course of investigating, determining and
- 325 adjudicating an alleged violation.
- The remedies, duties, prohibitions and penalties set forth
- 327 under this article shall not be exclusive and shall be in addition
- 328 to all other causes of action, remedies and penalties provided by
- 329 law, including, but not limited to, the penalties provided by
- 330 Section 77-1-53.
- 331 **SECTION 14.** Section 77-3-727, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 332 reenacted as follows:
- 333 77-3-727. Any person who has received a telephone
- 334 solicitation in violation of this article, or any rules and
- 335 regulations promulgated pursuant to this article, may file a
- 336 complaint with the commission. The complaint will be processed
- 337 pursuant to complaint procedures established by the commission.
- 338 **SECTION 15.** Section 77-3-729, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 339 reenacted as follows:
- 340 77-3-729. It shall be a defense in any action or proceeding
- 341 brought under Section 77-3-725 or 77-3-727 that the defendant has
- 342 established and implemented, with due care, reasonable practices
- 343 and procedures to effectively prevent telephone solicitations in
- 344 violation of this article.
- 345 **SECTION 16.** Section 77-3-731, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 346 reenacted as follows:
- 347 77-3-731. The commission is granted personal jurisdiction
- 348 over any telephone solicitor, whether a resident or a nonresident,
- 349 notwithstanding that telephone solicitors are not deemed to be a
- 350 public utility, for the purpose of administering this article.
- 351 The commission is granted personal jurisdiction over any
- 352 nonresident telephone solicitor, its executor, administrator,
- 353 receiver, trustee or any other appointed representative of such
- 354 nonresident as to an action or proceeding authorized by this
- 355 article or any rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to this
- 356 article as authorized by Section 13-3-57, and also upon any

- 357 nonresident, his or her executor, administrator, receiver, trustee
- 358 or any other appointed representative of such nonresident who has
- 359 qualified under the laws of this state to do business herein.
- 360 Service of summons and process upon the alleged violator of this
- 361 article shall be had or made as is provided by the Mississippi
- 362 Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 363 **SECTION 17.** Section 77-3-733, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 364 reenacted as follows:
- 365 77-3-733. Any party aggrieved by any final order of the
- 366 commission pursuant to this article, or any rules and regulations
- 367 promulgated pursuant to this article, shall have the right of
- 368 appeal to the Chancery Court of Hinds County, Mississippi, First
- 369 Judicial District.
- 370 **SECTION 18.** Section 77-3-735, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 371 reenacted as follows:
- 372 77-3-735. No provider of telephonic caller identification
- 373 service, local exchange telephone company or long distance company
- 374 certificated by the commission may be held liable for violations
- 375 of this article committed by other persons or entities.
- 376 **SECTION 19.** Section 77-3-737, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 377 amended as follows:
- 378 77-3-737. Sections 77-3-701 through 77-3-737 shall stand
- 379 repealed from and after July 1, 2007.
- 380 **SECTION 20.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 381 and after July 1, 2005.
